Dear Mr. Webb:

Pursuant to RSA 362-F:11, III, Renewable Portfolio Standard eligibility determinations of generation facilities that use biomass fuels are conditional. Within ten days of receiving the quarterly notice from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (DES) that a facility has met DES emissions standards, the Commission must designate the facility as eligible to produce Renewable Energy Certificates.

Based on the DES recommendation received November 12, 2014, the Commission hereby certifies the following wood-fired power plants as renewable energy sources for the third quarter of 2014, as the facilities meet average emission rates of 0.02 lb/MMBtu and 0.075 lb/MMBtu, for total suspended particulate matter (TSP) and nitrogen oxides (NOx), respectively:
