ORDER OF NOTICE

On September 16, 2008, New Hampshire Gas Corporation (NHGC), a public utility providing propane air service to approximately 1,000 customers in Keene, New Hampshire, filed revisions to its lariff providing for this, cost of gas (COG) rates for the winter period, November 1, 2008 through April 30, 2009. The proposed COG rate is \$2.2208 per therm, a \$0.456 per therm increase from the weighted average COG rate of \$1.7648 per therm for last winter. NHGC also proposed a \$2.2408 per therm program.

NHGC further proposed that the deferred revenue surcharge effective November 1, 2008 would be \$0.0532 per therm, a \$0.0062 increase over the deferred revenue surcharge of \$0.0470 per therm in effect during the summer 2008 COG period. New

As a result of the change in the deferred revenue sursistance and the proposed change in the COG rate, a hypical residential heating customer's winter bill would be \$2,961, an increase of \$441, or 17.5 percent, compared to last winter's bill.

The filing raises, inter alia, it issues related to the reason ableness of rates and nearges pursuant to RSA 378, including forecasting of sales, supplier prices and transportation prices, operational issues and reconciliar tion of prior period costs and revenues.
