Dear Ms. Howland:

The OCA recommends that the Commission treat this, and all other petitions pursuant to RSA 369, as an adjudicatory proceeding pursuant to RSA 541-A:31. Accordingly, the Commission should require PEU to notify its existing customers, as well as its potential customers served by the Pittsfield Aqueduct Company "North Country" systems, of the pending financing petition. The Commission should also allow these customers an opportunity to be heard, before the Commission rules on that petition.

Ultimately, PEU will seek recovery of the amount financed and the costs associated with the financing from its customers. At that point in time, however, it will be too late for the customers to question the terms or use of the financing. As the Commission has just seen, in another docket related to PAC, DW 08-052, the consequences of long-term financing approval can be far reaching. Keeping customers informed of financing requests serves all involved: the customers have notice and a chance to participate in the process; the Company benefits from having informed customers; and the Commission's future prudence review of the use of the debt may be less adversarial as a result.

Consequently, it is both appropriate and consistent with the public good determination required by RSA 369:1 to afford PEU's existing and potential customers with reasonable notice and an opportunity to be heard on these issues at this time. We recommend that the Commission issue an order of notice promptly to begin this process.
