



Dear Director Howland:



As directed, the Company and the Staff¹ recently met and discussed this matter. Currently, UES allocates net default service bad debt costs (the uncollected accounts) to the Non-G1 and G1 classes based on each class's default service kWh billed each month. Going forward, the Company and Staff recommend that UES charge the monthly write-offs of bad debt to Non-G1 and G1 default service costs based on the actual gross default service bad debt by class. Any recoveries would be allocated between Non-G1 and G1 default service, with the allocation also based on the monthly gross write-off amounts. Staff and UES agree that the transition to this method become effective with the next change to the Company's default service rates, expected on November 1, 2010. As part of its next default service filing, UES will include revisions to its default service tariff to reflect this change.
