Dear Mr. Mason:

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("DES") conducted a sanitary survey on the subject public water system on November 22, 2011, pursuant to RSA 485.4 and New Hampshire Administrative Rules Env-Dw 717 and Env-Dw 720. During the sanitary survey, certain deficiencies were documented and you were provided a copy of the Sanitary Survey Deficiency Report. Noted on the Sanitary Survey Deficiency Report was the requirement that you either (1) correct the deficiencies within 30 days of receipt of the Sanitary Survey Deficiency Report and notify DES in writing; or (2) submit a Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") outlining your schedule and plans for correcting the deficiencies.

You are receiving this Notice of Violation because DES records indicate that the significant deficiencies listed below have not been addressed. If our records are incorrect, please notify this office in writing as soon as possible. Please be advised that if the subject system has not corrected the deficiencies or is not in compliance with a DES approved CAP by March 21, 2012, a Treatment Technique Violation will be incurred, Public Notice of the Violation will be required, and further action will be issued.

SIGNIFICANT DEFICIENCIES:

- Top of Well can be Flooded (FLW) The point well in the pumphouse is at risk of flooding over the cap.
- <u>Flooding Occurring Inside Pumphouse (FPH)</u> Flooding is occurring as the result of a temporary water line that is leaking; this situation must be corrected immediately.
- <u>Significant Deficiency (SIG)</u> Electrical hazard in pumphouse; wiring attached with wire nuts in a flooded situation.
- <u>Treatment Inoperative (TRF)</u> At the time of the inspection, treatment was inoperative due to hazardous flooding conditions that prohibit entering the pumphouse to maintain the treatment operations.
- Significant Deficiency (SIG) Continuous leaks in distribution system; distribution system needs to be upgraded.

Failure to comply with this Notice of Violation will result in the issuance of a Letter of Deficiency or other enforcement action, which will be posted on the DES website and remain posted for a period of 5 years after compliance is achieved. Furthermore, pursuant to RSA 485:58, failure to comply with these requirements may result in the imposition of an administrative order, or referral to the NH Department of Justice for imposition of appropriate penalties. Also, water supply systems with outstanding deficiencies will be denied their requests for reductions in sampling or other waiver requests.

The records of the Department of Environmental Services ("DES") indicate that the sample results for the tests specified below were not submitted, or could not be accepted as compliance samples. As a result, you are hereby notified that the following violation(s) has occurred:

Failure to Monitor/Report for:

Routine Water Quality for Lead and Copper Corrosion Control

Violation of NH Admin Rule:

Env-Dw 714

Samples were due by:

December 31, 2011

Please note that make up samples are not due for this type of violation. However, pursuant to Env-Dw 714 you are required to begin collecting water quality samples immediately. These samples are to be collected bi-weekly from the distribution entry point and quarterly from 1 distribution tap. If you have taken samples for the previous sampling period, please forward the results to us and your records will be modified accordingly.

Pursuant to Env-Dw 801, failure to comply with the provisions of Env-Dw 714 requires that you give notice of such failure to each consumer of the water system within 30 days as specified on the enclosed public notice. **Proof of public notification** should be submitted to this office within 10 days of providing public notice to avoid further enforcement action.

Due to the fact that this is considered a monitoring **and** reporting violation, upon receipt of six full months of water quality samples **and** proof of public notice, our records will be updated to indicate that you are in compliance and the violation will be closed. Please note that, to minimize excess paper use, a written response will not be sent by DES upon receipt of sample results.

Failure to comply with this Notice of Violation will result in the issuance of Letter of Deficiency or other enforcement action, which will be posted on the DES website and remain posted for a period of 5 years after compliance is achieved. Furthermore, pursuant to RSA 458:58, failure to comply with the monitoring, reporting, and/or public notice requirements may result in the imposition of an administrative order, or referral to the NH Department of Justice for imposition of appropriate penalties.
