Dear Ms. Howland:

After the Default Energy Service Rate hearing closed in this proceeding, Mr. Frederick B. White believes he provided an answer to some questions from Chairman Getz that needs to be clarified. Mr. White stated that the current inventory of residual fuel oil on hand would allow Newington Station to run for six and one half weeks serving peak loads (16 hours per weekday). If Newington is called on to run at full load around the clock, as it has done in the past, the inventory on hand would be sufficient for a run of approximately 21 days.

Enclosed please find seven copies of the response to a record request concerning actual sales growth and forecasted sales growth which was reserved as Exhibit 4 in the Transmission Cost Adjustment Mechanism hearing.

Thank you for the opportunity to clarify the record.
