Request:

UES requested recovery of certain costs labeled "Ongoing Program Management and Reporting Costs," which were estimated at \$135,640 for 2010. Does the Company's step adjustment request include those estimated costs? If so, specify where in the filing those costs can be found. If some or all of the estimated costs are not included in the step-adjustment, please explain how those costs will be collected.

Response:

No, the Company has not requested costs in the category it had labeled "Ongoing Program Management and Reporting Costs" in DE 09-137. In the Commission's Final Order No. 25,111, the Commission declined to approve recovery of such costs through the cost recovery process authorized in its Order, therefore the Company is not seeking recovery of such costs in its step adjustment filing in this docket.

The Company has made every effort to minimize expenses that would have fallen into the category of Ongoing Program Management and Reporting including expenses associated with its continuing activities in relation to the projects approved in DE 09-137. Given that such costs were not recoverable in the DER step adjustment process, the appropriate avenue for recovery of any such costs would be in the context of a base rate case as part of ongoing operation and maintenance expense. Notably, however, none of these costs were included in the test period in the Company's pending base rate case in Docket DE 10-055.

Please specify the status of the micro-turbine and Solar PV projects. That is, is construction complete and, if so, are the projects operational? Please provide the date each project became operational.

Response:

The two generation projects are fully operational. The final letter of authorization for the interconnected operation of the microturbine was issued on August 17, 2010, and the final letter of authorization for the interconnected operation of the solar PV project was issued on August 31, 2010. Both were placed in commercial operation immediately upon receipt of the letters. Copies of the letters of authorization are attached as Attachment Staff 1-2. The final segment of solar panels, bringing the project to 100kW from 75kW, went online on September 22, 2010.
