#### RULEMAKING

N.H. Code Admin. Rules PART Puc 100 Organizational Rules, and PART Puc 200, Rules of Practice and Procedure

## ORDER OF NOTICE

On July 28, 2011, the Commission voted pursuant to RSA 541-A to initiate a rulemaking for N.H. Code Admin. Rules PART Puc 100, Organizational Rules, and PART Puc 200, Rules of Practice and Procedure. The specific sections amended, as presented in the Commission's Initial Proposal, are as follows. Puc 102.19 provides a definition of "Routine Filings" for documents submitted, on a recurrent basis, by a utility to the Commission outside of an adjudicative proceeding (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule). Puc 104.01 governs requests for public access to information submitted to the Commission (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule). Puc 201.04 governs submission of documents, as public records, to the Commission (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule). Puc 201.06 governs requests for confidential treatment of documents submitted by utilities in Routine Filings (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule, with amendments for technical accuracy to Puc 201.06(a)(15), (16), and (18)). Puc 201.07 governs requests for release to the public of confidential documents submitted in routine filings (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule). Puc 203.02 governs general filing requirements for documents submitted in adjudicative proceedings before the Commission (presenting clarifying amendments regarding the numbers of paper copies submitted). Puc 203.08 governs motions for confidential treatment in adjudicative proceedings (a readoption from an existing Interim Rule).

Puc 203.22 governs the marking of documents and other materials as exhibits in hearings before the Commission (presenting amendments clarifying procedures for marking materials that have been previously submitted to the Commission as exhibits at hearings). Puc 207.01 governs the issuance of declaratory rulings by the Commission (presenting an amendment clarifying that the Commission shall dismiss petitions for declaratory rulings not within its jurisdiction).

A rulemaking notice form (Notice), as required by RSA 541-A:6, was filed with the Office of Legislative Services on August 15, 2011. The Notice sets forth a date for a public hearing to be held at the Commission and a deadline for the submission of written comments. That notice is appended hereto.

A copy of the Rulemaking Notice will be sent to all regulated utilities and to those parties previously requesting notice of rulemakings. Pursuant to RSA 541-A:6, III, notice will also be provided by public notice advertisement in a publication of daily statewide circulation.

ORDERED, that a Public Hearing, pursuant to RSA 541-A:11, be held before the Commission located at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire, on September 20, 2011 at 10:00 a.m., and that the deadline for submission of materials in writing or via e-mail shall be October 3, 2011, as set forth in the Notice; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to RSA 541-A:6, III, the Commission shall undertake a public notice advertisement by publishing a copy of this Order together with the Notice no later than September 1, 2011, in a newspaper with a daily statewide circulation,

publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before September 26, 2011.
