## Re: Docket No. DE 11-__; Granite State Electric Company d/b/a National Grid 2012 Retail Rate Adjustment

Dear Ms. Howland:

I am writing to request that the Commission open a docket to consider the annual retail rate adjustment filing by Granite State Electric Company d/b/a National Grid relating to National Grid`s stranded cost and transmission charges. National Grid anticipates making its full filing on or before November 30, 2011 , but is providing advance notice to the Commission becausc of the need to schedule a hearing date in December and provide appropriate public notice of the proceeding. The proposed rates will be for effect with scrvice rendered on and after January 1 , 2012. The average rates anticipated to be proposed for 2012 and the rates currently in effect are set forth below for the Commission's information. The Company`s full filing will provide the rates on a class-specific basis.

If approved, the rates being proposed by National Grid would result in an average increase of $\$ 0.55$ per month or $0.81 \%$, from $\$ 68.12$ per month to $\$ 68.67$ per month for the typical residential customer on Default Service using 500 kWh per month. In addition, a bill comparison for a Default Service residential customer with usage of 672 kWh , which is the average monthly usage over the twelve month period from November 2010 through October

2011 , shows an increase of $\$ 0.74$ per month or $0.80 \%$ as compared to rates in effect today, or a bill increase of from $\$ 92.30$ to $\$ 93.04$.
