

May 24, 2012 I. BACKGROUND

Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc. (Aquarion) is a regulated public utility pursuant to RSA 362:2 and RSA 362:4 and serves approximately 8,700 customers in the towns of Hampton, North Hampton, and Rye. On April 17, 2012, Aquarion filed a Verified Petition for authority to issue a \$5 million General Mortgage Bond. On April 18, 2012, Aquarion filed the original signature page to accompany the Verified Peti-tion. On April 25, 2012, Aquarion filed its Board of Directors Consent approving the proposed bond, and copies of the Bond Purchase Agreement and Ninth Supplemental Indenture. The petition and sub-sequent docket filings, other than information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, is posted to the Commission's rebsite at

http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/ Docketbk/2012/12-098.html.

Aquarion intends to use the proceeds of the bond to retire an existing \$4 million debt obligation, and to use the remaining \$1 million for capital improvements. Aquarion proposes to borrow the \$5 mil-lion from CoBank, ACB (CoBank) on a ten year term at an interest rate of 4.45%. CoBank is a federally chartered bank and a Government Sponsored Enterprise (GSE) owned by its customers and is-sues debt with the full faith and credit of the U.S. Government. As a cooperative, CoBank provides a return through "patronage payments" to borrowers, which can be passed through to Aquarion's ratepayers through normal ratemaking in future years. Conditions of the financing include that the bond be secured by a mortgage on Aquarion's real property. Aquarion must also join the cooperative by purchasing stock in CoBank at a cost of \$1,000.

The existing loan to be retired is with Aquarion's parent, Aquarion Company, Inc. and carries an interest rate of 4.62%. See Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc., Order No. 25,072, 95 NH PUC 48 (2010). The remaining \$1 million of the bond will be dedicated to capital improvements, including projects under Aquarion's Water Infrastructure and Conservation Adjustment (WICA) program.

Aquarion estimates its debt issuance for this transaction to be \$70,500. Aquarion requests that, because its ar-rangement with CoBank is conditioned upon closing on the bond no later than July 6, 2012, the Commission issue an order with an effective date which will allow adequate time for the thirty-day statutory rehearing period to expire prior to closing.

On May 16, 2012, Staff filed a let-ter recommending the Commission ap-prove Aquarion's petition. Staff stated that it had reviewed the filing and had conducted discovery, which it attached to its recommendation. Staff stated that Aquarion's ratepayers will benefit from the refinancing of higher cost debt and that the \$5 million bond will reduce the company's weighted average cost of debt from 6.20% to 6.04%. Staff further stated that this cost reduction could be re-flected in Aquarion's recently filed general rate case, Docket No. 12-085.

II. COMMISSION ANALYSIS

Pursuant to RSA 369:1, public utili-ties engaged in business in this State may issue evidence of indebtedness pay-able more than 12 months after the date thereof only if the Commission finds the proposed issuance to be "consistent with the public good." Analysis of the public good consideration involves looking beyond the actual terms of the propos financing to the use of the proceeds, and the effect on rates, in order to insure that the public good is protected. See Appeal of Easton, 125 N.H. 205, 211 (1984). As we have previously noted. "certain financing related circumstances are routine, calling for more limited Commission re-view of the purposes and impacts of the financing, while other requests may be at the opposite end of the spectrum, calling for vastly greater exploration of the intended uses and impacts of the proposed financing." In re Public Service Company of New Hampshire, Order No. 25,050, 94 NH PUC 691, 699 (2009). We find that a limited review of the proposed financing is appropriate. Aquarion has asked to borrow \$5 million to retire an existing loan as well as to finance water system improvements in its franchise area. Aquarion will retire an existing \$4 million loan which carries a higher interest rate than the proposed bond issue. The proposed capital improvements are a part of the company's WICA program and include replacement of water mains and customer meters. Aquarion's WICA program, entails review and pre-approval of capital projects designed to address the issue of periodic replacement of aging infrastructure in Aquarion's distribution system. Aquarion's approved budget for 2012 is \$973,350. We have reviewed the proposed terms of the financing as well quarion's intended use of the funds and find that Aquarion has demonstrated that the proposed refinancing will enable it to provide better service to its custom-ers at a reasonable cost. We consider the capital expenditures and associated financing to be good utility practice. We find the use of the proceeds of the financing to be reasonable and appropriate.

On April 17, 27:12, Aquarion filed '1 Verified Petition for authority to issue a \$5 million General Mortgage Hond. On April 18, 2012, Aquarion filed the original signature page to accompany the Verified Petition. On April 25, 2012, Amurica filed the Board of Mortes Company tenter towns and the Statement of the Statement Statemen 2012, Aquarion filed its Boaro of Directors Consent approving the proposed bond, and copies of the Bond Purchase Agreement and Ninth Supple-mental Indenture. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than information for which confider tial treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, is posted to the Commission's website at

http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2012/12-098.html. Aquarion intends to use the proceeds of the bond to retire an existing \$4 million debt obligation, and to use the remaining \$1 million for capital improvements. Aquarion proposes to borrow the SS million form Co8ank, ACB (Co8ank) on a ten year term at an interest rate of 4.45%. Co8ank is a feder-(CoBank) on a ten year term at an i. terest rate of 4.45%. LOBARK is a recur ally chartered bank and a Government Sponsored Enterprise (ISSE) owned by its customers and issues debt with the full faith and credit of the U.S. Government. As a cooperative, CoBank provides a return through "patron-cooperate" to horrowers, which can be passed through to Aquarion's age payments" to borrowers, which i an be passed through to Aquarion's ratepayers through normal ratemaking in future years. Conditions of the financing include that the bond be secured by a nortgage on Aquarion's real property. Aquarion must also join the cooperative by purchasing stock in CoBank at a cost of \$1,000.

Aquarion's approved budget for 2012 is \$973,350. We have reviewed the proposed terms of the financing as well as Aquarion's intended use of the funds and find that Aquarion has demonstrated that the proposed refinanc-ing will enable it to provide better service to its customers at a reasonable cost. 

BACKGROUND

Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc. (Aquarion) is a regulated public utility pursuant to RSA 352:2 and RSA 352:4 and serves approximately 8,700 customers in the towns of Hampton, North Hampton, and Rye. On April 17, 2012, Aquarion filed a Verified Petition for authority to issue a \$5 million General Mortgage Bond. On April 18, 2012, Aquarion filed the original signature page to accompany the Verified Petition. On April 25, 2012, Aquarion filed its Board of Directors Consent approving the proposed bond, and copies of the Bond Purchase Agreement and Ninth Supple-mental Indenture. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, is posted to the Commission's website at http://www.uc.nh.gou/Regulatory/Docketbk/2012/12-098.html. Aquarion intends to use the proceeds of the bond to retire an existing \$4 million debt obligation, and to use the remaining \$1 million for CoBark, ACB Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc. (Aquarion) is a regulated

provements. Aquarion and to use the remaining \$1 million for capital im-provements. Aquarion proposes to borrow the \$5 million from CoBank, ACB (CoBank) on a ten year term at an interest rate of 4.45%. CoBank is a feder-ally chartered bank and a Government Sponsored Enterprise (GSE) owned by its customers and issues debt with the full faith and credit of the U.S. Government. As a cooperative, CoBank provides a return through "patron age payments" to borrowers, which can be passed through to Aquarion's ratepayers through normal ratemaking in future years. Conditions of the financing include that the bond be secured by a mortgage on Aquarion's real property. Aquarion must also join the cooperative by purchasing stock in CoBank at a cost of \$1,000.

In Cobains at a cost of Stouc. The existing loan to be retired is with Aquarion's parent, Aquarion Com-pany, Inc. and carries an interest rate of 4.62%. See Aquarion Water Com-pany of New Hampshire, Inc., Order No. 25,072, 95 NH PUC 48 (2010). The remaining \$1 million of the bond will be dedicated to capital improve Including projects under Aquarion's Water Infrastructure and Conservation Adjustment (WICA) program. Aquarion estimates its debt issuance costs for this transaction to be

Aquanon estimates its debit issuance costs for units unascuon to be \$70,500. Aquarion requests that, because its arrangement with CoBank is conditioned upon closing on the bond no later than July 6, 2012, the Com-mission issue an order with an effective date which will allow adequate time for the thirty-day statutory rehearing period to expire prior to closing. On May 16, 2012, Staff filed a letter recommending the Commission approve Aquarion's petition. Staff stated that it had reviewed the filing and had conducted discovery, which it attached to its recommendation. Staff stated that Aquarion's ratepayers will benefit from the refinancing of higher cost debt and that the \$5 million bond will reduce the company's weighted average cost of debt from 6.20% to 6.04%. Staff further stated that this cost reduction could be reflected in Aquarion's recently filed general rate case, Docket No. 12-085.

COMMISSION ANALYSIS

Pursuant to RSA 369:1, public utilities engaged in business in this State may issue evidence of indebtedness payable more than 12 months after the date thereof only if the Commission finds the proposed issuance to be "consistent with the public good." Analysis of the public good consider-ation involves looking beyond the actual terms of the proposed financing to the use of the proceeds, and the effect on rates, in order to insure that the public good is protected. See Appeal of Easton, 125 N.H. 205, 211 (1984). As we have previously noted, "certain financing related circumstances arr routine, calling for more limited Commission review of the purposes and impacts of the financing, while other requests may be at the opposite end of the spectrum, calling for vastly greater exploration of the intended uses and impacts of the proposed financing." In re Public Service Company of New Hampshire, Order No. 25,050, 94 NH PUC 631, 639 (2009), We find that a limited myour of the arconoch financing is a composition. a limited review of the proposed financing is appropriate. Aquarion has asked to borrow \$5 million to retire an existing loan as well

as to finance water system improvements in its franchise area. Aquarion will retire an existing \$4 million loan which carries a higher interest rate than the proposed bond issue. The proposed capital improvements are a part of the company's WICA program and include replacement of water mains and customer meters. Aquarion's WICA program, entails review and pre-approval of capital projects designed to address the issue of periodic replacement of eging infrastructure in Aquarion's distribution system. Aquarion's approved budget for 2012 is \$973,350. We have reviewed the proposed terms of the financing as well as Aquarion's intended use of the finds and find that Aquarion has demonstrated that the proposed refinanc-ing will enable it to provide better service to its customers at a reasonable cost. We consider the capital expenditures and associated financing to be good utility practice. We find the use of the proceeds of the financing to be

reasonable and appropriate. As to the terms and the effect of this financing on rates, the Ioan funds are provided on favorable terms. The interest rate is 4.45%, and will replace current financing an interest rate of 4.62%. According to Aquarion's filing and Staff's recommendation, this financing can be reflected in Aquarion's and stars recommendation, and mainting can be reneared in Aquations recently file general rate case and will reduce the overall cost of debt, providing a benefit to customers. We find the terms and the potential futur effect of the financing on rates to be reasonable. Having reviewed the filing and Staff's recommendation, we find the

proposed financing to be consistent with the public good and we approve hopposed mancing to be consistent while the paolic good and we approve the amount and purpose of the financing. We also approve Aquarion's mortgage of its real property in connection with this financing pursuant to RSA 369:2. Our approval is given on the condition that the final terms not be substantially different from those proposed in the filing. If such terms vary
