Dear Mr. McNeil:

On April 18, 2012, you submitted applications on behalf of homeowners Timothy Lyons (Lyons), Susan Linnemayr (Linnemayr), Robert Fenton (Fenton), and Benjamin F. Berry (Berry) requesting the Commission grant approval of photovoltaic facilities located at each of their residences to produce Class II, Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law. Staff has reviewed these applications and has recommended approval of the Lyons, Linnemayr, Fenton, and Berry photovoltaic arrays as eligible for Class II RECs effective April 18, 2012.


Since these facilities are customer-sited sources, the output is not recorded in the New England Power Pool Market Settlement System and, as a result, the output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor. Your application states that NHEC will monitor the facilities' output as required by N.H. Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08 and 2505.09. These facilities' total output will also be included in the *NHEC Class II Aggregation*'s total output reported to the NEPOOL Generation Information System as approved by the Commission on April 9, 2010.

<sup>1</sup> NHEC considers the operation date listed in the table above, and in Exhibit E of each application, to be the date on which NHEC inspected each facility and installed a revenue quality meter to record the electricity that will be eligible for Class II RECs. The date listed in each interconnection application pertains to the installation and interconnection of the facility and may be different than the operation date listed in the above table.

<sup>2</sup> This is the effective date to produce RECs if the Commission approves this facility eligible to produce Class II RECs.
