On May 29, 2012, TDS Telecom, Inc., on behalf of Merrimack County Telephone Company and Wilton Telephone Company (collectively, TDS), filed a request with the Commission to overturn a decision of the North American Numbering Plan Administrator (NANPA) denying TDS' request for two additional central office codes. TDS contended that it had a need for the codes and that there were no other remedies available to it. TDS also stated that use of the codes would not contribute to waste or exhaust of numbering resources in New Hampshire.

Following a period of negotiation, Staff and TDS reached an agreement relative to TDS' request, signed on July 10, 2012, and filed herewith in confidential and public versions. The confidential version is redacted to protect information in line with TDS' previously filed motion for confidential treatment. The agreement confirms the temporary use of the codes by TDS, that the codes will be returned following the temporary period of use, and that use of the codes will not immediately jeopardize the supply of codes in New Hampshire. The agreement further confirms the Commission's authority over any issues relating to the agreement or any extension to it.

Staff and TDS request that the Commission accept and approve the agreement. Further, Staff and TDS recommend that pursuant to the agreement, the Commission overturn the decision of NANPA to deny TDS' request for two additional codes.



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AGREEMENT BETWEEN TDS TELECOM, INC. AND THE COMMISSION STAFF

This AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is executed and effective as of the ____ day of July, 2012, by and between TDS TELECOM, INC. and the Staff of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (the "Staff").

RECITALS:




The Central Office Code Assignment Guidelines employed by NANPA establish number utilization requirements. These requirements exist for the purpose of conserving numbering resources, which the Commission has a statutory duty to pursue under RSA 374:59. TDS does not meet the requirements to obtain additional numbering resources. TDS and the Staff agree that the NXX codes will be used only on a temporary basis, and that the assignment of these codes will not immediately jeopardize the supply of codes within the 603 Numbering Plan Area.

Accordingly, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. TDS agrees the Commission has jurisdiction to adjudicate any disputes or issues that arise from this agreement, if necessary, pursuant to RSA 374:59.



6. TDS agrees to participate in number pooling in each of its New Hampshire exchanges.

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7. Staff supports TDS's request for waiver of NANPA's denial of numbering resources, and recommends the Commission grant the waiver, consistent with the terms herein.
