1 PROCEEDING

CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: Good morning. I'd like to open the hearing in docket DRM 12-298, which is a rulemaking hearing addressing PUC Rules Chapter 1400 regarding pipeline utilities. The Commission voted on December 19th, 2012 to initiate a rulemaking for the Chapter 1400 Rules. We have an Initial Proposal that is a readoption of the existing 1400 rules, with some amendments that are designed to clarify existing requirements regarding circumstances when test results and summary of records shall be provided to the Commission. And, once approved, those rules would replace the current version of Puc 1400.

By Order of Notice dated January 8th,
2013, we scheduled a public hearing for the purpose of
taking comments on the Initial Proposal for this morning.
And, it appears that we do not have members of the public
who have appeared -- I mean, who have attended to speak to
the rules, but we do have Commission Staff.

So, let's begin with taking just identification of Staff and any description of the most significant changes between the existing rules and the future rules. If anyone else arrives while we're in the hearing, we'll, obviously, take comments from them.

So, Ms. Fabrizio.

MS. FABRIZIO: Thank you, Chairman.

Lynn Fabrizio, on behalf of Staff. And, with me at the table today is Randy Knepper, Director of the Safety

Division at the Commission. In this rulemaking, Staff made efforts to clarify one provision that wasn't clear to Staff itself, and that is 1402.01(a). And, we have made revisions that would require submission of test results or a summary of records only upon request by the Commission. This is a rather open-ended provision, but we felt that it was necessary to be relatively open, to provide, in particular, the Safety Division the opportunity to request test results. So, rather than limit the circumstances explicitly in the rule, we kept it as an open request by the Commission for such items.

And, other revisions made were really simply typographical, to clean up existing language.

CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: What's the time frame we're looking at as the rules move forward?

MS. FABRIZIO: Well, the next step would be to finalize a Final Proposal, that we would then submit to the Office of Legislative Services for their comments, upon receiving any comments from them and making indicated changes. It would then be submitted to JLCAR for a

1 review. These rules expired on I believe it was 2 December 31st. But they're, we have 100 -- we did file 3 the Initial Proposal and given 150 days from that date, plus an additional 30 days, as necessary, under the new 4 5 statute. So, I think, given that there have been 6 7 no public comments whatsoever, and we did circulate this to out service list of operators, and the fact that there 8 9 is nobody here today, I expect that we could finalize the 10 Final Proposal within a week and submit it to OLS and keep 11 the process moving fairly quickly. 12 CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: All right. 13 notice also, I should have mentioned, that the proposal 14 was published December 27, 2012 in the formal rulemaking 15 notice through the Office of Legislative Services.

MS. FABRIZIO: Yes. In fact, I got at least half a dozen requests from outside counsel and lobbyists seeking copies of the rules. So, we know that the word did get out.

CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: We also, in that notice and in our order, allowed for written submissions no later than January 29th, 2013. So, we may receive further comments at that date.

Any other questions?

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1	CMSR. HARRINGTON: I don't have any.	
2	CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: All right. Then,	
3	why don't we await any further written materials that come	
4	in. It says by writing in writing or an e-mail would	
5	both be acceptable. And, once those, anything is received	
6	and digested, probably will inform whether you need more	
7	time, any other sessions with people to discuss any	
8	proposals. If nothing comes in, then I think your idea of	
9	moving forward right away on working towards a final	
10	submission makes sense.	
11	Thank you. Then, if nothing further,	
12	we'll see if anything arrives on January 29th and take it	
13	from there. Thank you. We're adjourned.
