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CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning,
everyone. We're here this morning in Docket DE 15-459, a
filing by Northern Pass Transmission, LLC, to commence
business as a public utility. We're here for a prehearing
conference, which will be followed by a technical session
of the parties, but won't involve us.

As you see, Commissioner Scott is not here. Commissioner Scott has recused himself from participation in this docket. And, so, he will not be participating.

Before we go any further, let's take appearances.

MR. GETZ: Good morning, Mr. Chairman,
Commissioner. I'm Tom Getz, on behalf of Devine, Millimet
& Branch, appearing for Northern Pass Transmission, LLC.
And, also with me is Marvin Bellis, Senior Counsel for
Eversource Energy.

MS. CHAMBERLIN: Susan Chamberlin,
Consumer Advocate. And, with me today is Pradip
Chattopadhyay.

MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Suzanne
Amidon, for Commission Staff. And, I have Tom Frantz,
Director of the Electric Division, to my left, and

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       additional Staff from the Electric Division.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right.
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       there anything in the nature of preliminary matters we
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       need to deal with, before we take positions of the
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       parties? Ms. Amidon?
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                         MS. AMIDON: Not that I'm aware of.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Getz?
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                         MR. GETZ: No, Mr. Chairman. Except to
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       note that the required filing of the affidavit of
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      publication was made.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: That's probably in
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       here somewhere. But thank you for noting that.
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                         I think then we'll ask the parties to
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       briefly state their positions, and what issues they
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       anticipate coming up, and see if there are any questions
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       the Commissioners may have as a result of those
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      presentations. Mr. Getz, you may begin.
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                         MR. GETZ: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
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       you're well aware, the Application for a Certificate of
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       Site and Facility for the Northern Pass electric
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       transmission project was accepted orally at the Site
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       Evaluation Committee's meeting on December 7. And, with
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       respect to this proceeding, inasmuch as the proposed
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       transmission line qualifies as a public utility under RSA
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362:2, Northern Pass Transmission seeks permission to commence business as a public utility pursuant to RSA 374:22.

The Company's position is set forth in much more detail in its Petition, where it lays out the history of the Commission's treatment of electric transmission utilities and the standard for approving petitions to commence business, which are premised on financial, managerial and technical expertise.

We note, in particular, in the Petition the Commission's treatment of Florida Power & Light, now NextEra. And, in that case, the Commission determined that the transmission facilities owned by NextEra associated with Seabrook were governed by RSA 362:2, and, in that case, the Commission approved a settlement agreement determining the scope of jurisdiction it would exercise over such facilities. And, Northern Pass proposes a comparable approach in this proceeding.

And, it's, you know, prepared to, during the technical session, start to address issues of what the procedural schedule would look like and what type of jurisdiction would be appropriate under the circumstances.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Chamberlin.

MS. CHAMBERLIN: Thank you. The OCA is

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       looking forward to engaging in discovery and participating
       in the proceeding. We don't have a position at this time.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Amidon.
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                         MS. AMIDON: Thank you. Staff intends
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       to begin to conduct discovery on this docket. We don't
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       have a procedural schedule to recommend to the parties,
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       but we plan to discuss that at the technical session.
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                         I will say that Staff does not
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       necessarily agree with the analogy between this filing and
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       the situation of Florida Power & Light and the
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       transmission substation associated with Seabrook. We will
       probably conduct discovery to determine whether that
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       analysis is appropriate or whether we should have a
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       different kind of analysis of this particular utility.
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                         And, we also have some additional
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       questions related to the underlying agreement. And, we
       will discuss -- begin to discuss that at the technical
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       session as well. Thank you.
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                              And, Staff will report back to the
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       Commission with a proposed schedule and the results of the
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       technical session.
                           Thank you.
                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I don't think we
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       have any questions of substance. How long do you
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       anticipate this one taking before we would be doing a
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hearing on the merits? Is this the kind of thing you expect to be done in three months? Six months? Nine months?

MS. AMIDON: Three to four. I don't see -- this is a fairly straightforward filing. I think that there may be some legal issues that we need to review.

But, I think, otherwise, it's a fairly straightforward filing. And, I would hope that we would be able to work out any differences with Northern Pass Transmission in kind of settlement discussions or something of that nature.

I understand that the SEC allows -requires an update on the status of the filing within 150
days. And, I think we also have -- are required to -- or,
the Commission is required to complete work on it within
240 days. I haven't seen any letter from the SEC to
confirm that time, but I don't know if it relates back to
the day that they made the decision, that would be Monday,
or the day that the letter is issued.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I believe the trigger date is the date that the letter is issued. And, I believe that has to be issued within ten days of the vote that was taken. So, I think the working assumption

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       for most people is that the clock is likely to start
       around the 18th, for deadlines that are SEC -- that are
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       associated with the SEC proceeding.
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                         Mr. Getz, is that your understanding as
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       well?
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                         MR. GETZ: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Anybody have any
       speculation, educated or otherwise, why no one else is
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       here, since we have a docket with "Northern Pass" in the
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       title?
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                         MR. GETZ:
                                    I would not speculate.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I kind of didn't
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       expect anybody to really want to speculate on the record
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       with that. But it's a little surprising to me that
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       there's no one else here. Maybe not -- not that they need
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       to be, but maybe they're waiting for a more substantive
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       event in this docket before they show up.
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                         Is there anything else we need to do
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       before we leave you to your technical session?
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                         MS. AMIDON: No.
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                         CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: If not, then I
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       think we will adjourn. Thank you all.
