# PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE D/B/A EVERSOURCE ENERGY

### **Petition to Cross Public Waters**

### **ORDER OF NOTICE**

On October 19, 2015, Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy (Eversource) filed a request for license to construct and maintain electric lines at fifteen locations over and across public waters. Eversource currently maintains nine 115 kV and two 34.5 kV electric lines constituting part of its electric system which cross over certain public waters in the towns of Bridgewater, Bristol, Dalton, Deerfield, Hill, Lancaster, New Hampton, Northfield, Pembroke and Stark, and in the cities of Concord and Franklin, New Hampshire. A description of the location of each crossing is contained in an attachment to the Order of Notice. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, will be posted to the Commission's website at <u>http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2015/15-460.html</u>.

Eversource requests this license in connection with an application to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee for a certificate of site and facility to construct a 192-mile-long highvoltage electric transmission line from the Canadian border to Deerfield. According to Eversource, the nine crossings referenced above need to be reconstructed in connection with the construction of the transmission line by Northern Pass Transmission LLC. With the exception of the crossing of the D142 line over the Israel River and Otter Brook in Lancaster, the 348X line over the Johns River in Dalton, and the P145 line over the Soucook River in Concord and Pembroke, all of the existing water body crossings have been previously licensed by the Commission. Eversource said that the crossings not previously licensed were due to oversight or to the application of navigability or other crossing license criteria at the time of original line construction. The rebuild of these crossings will be fully licensed by Eversource under the instant petition.

RSA 371:17 requires any utility, corporation, or individual desiring to cross any public water to petition the Commission for a license. Pursuant to RSA 371:20, the Commission shall grant a requested license if the petitioner demonstrates that the license may be exercised without substantially affecting the public rights in such waters. RSA 371:21 requires the Commission to determine the compensation, if any, to be paid to owners of land bordering on such public waters for damage thereto occasioned by the structures for which the license is granted, subject to an appeal as provided in RSA 371:10. RSA 371:21 also requires the Commission to determine the amount of compensation to be paid to the state for rights on public lands.

The filing raises, <u>inter alia</u>, issues related to whether the license is necessary to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public; whether the license, as requested or as conditioned by the Commission, may be exercised without substantially affecting the public rights in waters or lands; whether the crossings will be constructed and maintained according to the standards contained in the National Electrical Safety Code; ; and whether and what amount of compensation Eversource should pay to bordering landowners, the state, or both. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent the party at the party's own expense.

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## Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.15, be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on April 4, 2016, at 10:00 a.m., at which each party will provide a preliminary statement of its position with regard to the petition and any of the issues set forth in N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.15; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that, immediately following the Prehearing Conference, Eversource, the Staff of the Commission, and any Intervenors hold a Technical Session to review the petition and allow Eversource to provide any amendments or updates to its filing; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to RSA 371:19, Eversource shall notify the New Hampshire Attorney General, each town where the crossings will be constructed, and all owners of lands within 100 feet of the crossing of the affected state waters by providing a copy of this Order of Notice and attachment by United States Certified Mail, return receipt requested no later than March 21, 2016, such notice to be documented by affidavit listing the name and address of persons to whom notice was sent along with copies of the return receipts, filed with the Commission on or before March 30, 2016; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, Eversource shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice no later than March 18, 2016, in a newspaper with general circulation in those portions of the state in which the crossings are to be located, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before March 30, 2016; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that consistent with N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.17 and Puc 203.02, any party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the Commission

seven copies of a Petition to Intervene with copies sent to Eversource and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before March 30, 2016, such Petition stating the facts demonstrating how its rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be affected by the proceeding, as required by N.H. Code Admin. Rule Puc 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32,I(b); and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that any party objecting to a Petition to Intervene make said Objection on or before April 4, 2016.
