### 2016 Summer Period Cost of Gas Adjustment

## ORDER OF NOTICE

On March 16, 2016, Northern Utilities, Inc. (Northern) filed with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission) its proposed cost of gas (COG) rates for the summer period, May 1, 2016, through October 31, 2016. Included in the filing were revised tariff pages, prefiled testimony, and supporting materials for the proposed rates. The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, will be posted to the Commission's website at <a href="http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2016/16-309.html">http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2016/16-309.html</a>.

The proposed residential COG rate is \$0.3196 per therm, an increase of \$0.0234 per therm from the weighted average residential COG rate of \$0.2962 per therm for last summer. The proposed change to Northern's residential COG rate, combined with the other rate changes since last summer, is expected to increase a typical residential heating customer's bill for the entire summer by approximately \$2.33, or less than 1 percent, compared to last summer.

The proposed commercial/industrial low winter use COG rate is \$0.2832 per therm and the proposed commercial/industrial high winter use COG rate is \$0.3619 per therm, increases from last summer's weighted average COG rates of \$0.2253 per therm and \$0.3036 per therm, respectively.

The filing also incorporates a refund from Portland Natural Gas Transmission System (PNGTS), which totals approximately \$128,190 for the summer 2016 COG period, calculated pursuant to the methodology approved by the Commission in Order No. 25,816 (Sept. 22, 2015) in Docket No. DG 15-090. Northern did not propose any change in its Local Distribution Adjustment Charge (LDAC).

The filing raises, <u>inter alia</u>, issues related to: RSA Chapter 378 and the justness and reasonableness of rates, fares, and charges; the reasonableness of sales forecasts, supplier prices, and transportation prices; reconciliation of prior period costs and revenues; the causes and treatment of a prior period under-recovery and supplier refund credit, as authorized by Order No. 25,816; purchasing decisions related to the current and past summer supplies and capacity; revenue projections related to transportation services and released capacity; cost allocations between the New Hampshire and Maine Divisions, and revenues and rate impacts resulting from the proposed rate changes. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent the party at the party's own expense.

# Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, that a hearing be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on April 19, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that Northern, the Staff of the Commission, the Office of Consumer Advocate, and any intervenors hold a technical session on April 12, 2016, at 9:00 a.m., to review the petition and allow Northern to provide any amendments or updates to its filing; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, Northern shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice no later than April 5, 2016, in a newspaper with general circulation in those portions of the state in which operations are conducted, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before April 14, 2016; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that consistent with N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.17 and Puc 203.02, any party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the Commission seven copies of a Petition to Intervene with copies sent to Northern and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before April 14, 2016, such Petition stating the facts demonstrating how its rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be affected by the proceeding, as required by N.H. Code Admin. Rule Puc 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32,I(b); and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that any party objecting to a Petition to Intervene make said Objection on or before April 19, 2016.
