The undersigned legislators are requesting acknowledgement from the Public Utilities Commission to intervene in the acquisition of Aquarion Water Company by EverSource consistent with N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.17 and Puc 203.02 and the standards of RSA 541-A:32. In accordance with RSA 541-A:32 I.(b) the undersigned petitioners maintain that the acquisition of Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire by EverSource Energy would be a violation of the N.H. Antitrust Code 356:1, et seq. by creating a monopoly and conspiracy to restrain trade with control of electricity, natural gas, water for emergency response and residential, commercial and industrial water. Accordingly, we respectfully request consideration for this Petition to Intervene in the acquisition as specified in the July 13, 2017 notice in Docket No. DW 17-114.
