## PROCEEDING

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: We're here in

Docket DE 17-150, which is Eversource's Energy

Service rate proceeding. We're here for a

prehearing conference.

Before we do anything else, let's take appearances.

MR. FOSSUM: Good morning once again, Commissioners. Matthew Fossum, here for Public Service Company of New Hampshire doing business as Eversource Energy.

MR. BUCKLEY: Good morning, Mr.

Chairman and Commissioners. My name is Brian

D. Buckley. I'm a staff attorney with the

Office of the Consumer Advocate. And to my

left is Mr. James Brennan, Director of Finance

with the OCA. And we're here representing the

interests of residential ratepayers.

MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Suzanne
Amidon, for Commission Staff. And with me
today is Rich Chagnon, an Analyst with the
Electric Division.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Are there any procedural or preliminary matters we need to

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deal with before the parties state their positions?

MS. AMIDON: No.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Fossum, why don't you start us off.

MR. FOSSUM: Thank you. And I'll just make a reference over to the prior docket in which we had a prehearing conference this morning, in 17-151. Just to make note that some of the issues that affect that docket also impact this one.

But that said, relative to this docket specifically, in Order 26,056, issued by the Commission back in September, Eversource had been directed to file its Energy Service and Stranded Cost filings consistent with its past practice, and it has done so in this case.

It's our position that the Energy

Service rate for which we have filed, and for
which -- and which we are proposing to go into
effect on January 1st, is appropriately
calculated and otherwise just and reasonable,
and we would request that the Commission
approve the rate that we have filed, subject to

whatever other moving parts there may be in other dockets.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Buckley.

MR. BUCKLEY: The Office of the

Consumer Advocate is still evaluating the

issues presented in the instant Petition. But

is optimistic that the parties can work

together to reach an expedient and amicable

resolution of those issues.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Amidon.

MS. AMIDON: Thank you. The Company filed this pursuant to the order mentioned by Mr. Fossum. And, as we stated in the prior prehearing conference, there's another docket, 17-113, which proposes to address the post divestiture procurement of energy for Eversource.

Having said that, and recognizing that there's going to have to be some, I don't know if it's juggling, but some flexibility involved in terms of finding a solution to that docket, we're prepared to conduct the normal inquiry into this proceeding, and have already

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saved a date for a hearing in December,
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         assuming that we go forward with this in the
         typical manner. And we'll conduct -- begin
