CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning, everyone. We're here in Docket DE 18-073, Eversource's 2017 docket to reconcile energy service and stranded cost recovery charges. There are a lot of elements we know in this filing and a lot going on in this docket. After the prehearing conference, there will be a technical session.

Before we do anything else, let's take appearances.

doing business as Eversource Energy.

MR. BUCKLEY: Good morning, Mr.

Chairman and Commissioners. My name is Brian

D. Buckley. I am the staff attorney with the

New Hampshire Office of the Consumer

Advocate. To my left is Mr. James Brennan,

Director of Finance with the OCA. We're here

representing the interests of residential

ratepayers.

MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Suzanne

Amidon for Commission Staff. And to my left is Rich Chagnon, an analyst with the Electric Division.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Is there anything in the way of preliminary matters we need to deal with before getting the parties' preliminary position?

[No verbal response]

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CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right.

Seeing none, Mr. Fossum, why don't you start us off.

MR. FOSSUM: Thank you. I don't have a whole lot to say this morning. think, as you mentioned, there are a number of things going on. But generally speaking, this is a fairly routine filing. The 2017 year was not anything out of the ordinary. Ι would say, you know, by way of one note, one thing that is a little bit different is the inclusion of the lead/lag information as part of Mr. Goulding's testimony. And we're prepared to work through that issue with the Staff and the OCA, as we are prepared to work through any of the other issues that may come up, which will hopefully be minimal.

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One final note I did want to make this morning is that, as the Commission is certainly well aware, we are most of the way through, I dare say, divestiture. And so this retrospective review of our generation fleet involves looking at things over which we have less control now. And we are certainly prepared to get whatever information might be needed and to provide it in a timely and efficient manner. already discussed this briefly with the Staff and OCA, but I just wanted to note for the record that we're prepared to do everything we can to make this process as efficient as possible, despite the fact that many of the folks that had helped prepare these filings in the past no longer work for the Company.

Other than that, we look forward to working with the Staff and the OCA moving through this docket efficiently and resolving this reconciliation as quickly as we can.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Thank you,

Mr. Fossum.

Advocate is still evaluating the issues

raised in the instant petition. And

particularly, we are looking forward to

looking a bit further into the Lead/Lag

study, and we look forward to discussing that

parties. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Ms. Amidon.

MS. AMIDON: Good morning. Staff is still reviewing the filing. However, we agree with the Company's assertion that the filing represents no significant bumps or issues in the 2017 operation of the plants. And we've already prepared some discovery which we will schedule delivery with the Commission -- I mean with the Company. And we will take into account Mr. Fossum's advisement on the availability of people and provide the Company some flexibility in getting responses to us regarding discovery.
