 - Envelope upgrade with SIPs panels and windows to achieve a HERS rating to meet Energy Star Rating.





- > Low temperature/high efficiency Mitsubishi Air Source Heat Pumps for heating and cooling. (SEER>19)
- > Low flow water devices (1.28 gpm toilet, 1.5 gpm water faucets)
- > Roof mount solar photovoltaic system

This retrofit exceeds the New Hampshire Building Code Energy Requirements (IECC 2009)

6. If individual billing meters for each residential unit were required for this facility, what is the estimated additional cost to LHA?

Minimal expense. Wiring is designed to go to electrical room where there will be a bank of meter sockets (one per apartment) for any future change over, however, there will be one master meter in use.

7. Is LHA installing any kind of energy management system with the ability to monitor electrical usage in each residential unit? If not, how does LHA plan to monitor electrical usage?

No. As per program requirements the heat, cooling, domestic hot water, water, and electricity are included in the subsidized rent structure. Electric usage is monitored with the master meter.
