

ARRA Goals

Stimulate Job Growth

Save Energy, Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions

Assist Wide Range of Sectors

- Businesses, nonprofits, municipalities, counties, residents

Transform Markets

- Improve product efficiency
- Develop clean energy sector

Reporting: Transparency, Evaluation, Monitoring

- Davis Bacon, Historical Preservation, Buy American, NEPA, etc...

Coordinate with Existing Programs

ARRA Programs- OEP

Over \$75 million for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy

State Energy Program

- \$25.8 million

Federal Weatherization Assistance Program

- \$23.2 million

Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program

- Formula Granted: \$17.2 million
- Retrofit Ramp-up: \$10 million

State Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program

- \$1.2 million

Energy Assurance Program

- \$327,000

ARRA- NH Highlights

State Energy Program

- 16 programs spanning residential, business, nonprofit, government
- State Building Improvements \$10.7 million
- Enterprise Energy Fund (CDFA) \$3.5 million
(plus an additional \$3.1 million pending DOE and G&C approval)
- Green Launching Pad: \$750,000
(plus additional \$750k pending DOE and G&C approval)
- Over 75% under contract, almost all funding is committed

Federal Weatherization Assistance Program

- Over 989 Homes weatherized- 38% of goal (as of May 31, 2010)
- \$8 million in ARRA funds spent through June, 2010
- Expediting weatherization: One of only 12 states to receive full award

ARRA- NH Highlights

Energy Efficiency Conservation Block Grant Program

- \$7.1 million funded to 67 Municipalities for EE/RE projects
- Energy Technical Assistance and Planning: \$2 million
- Beacon Communities Project: \$10 million (1 of 25 applicants)

State Energy Efficiency Appliance Rebate Program

- Innovative program for solar thermal
- Saving more energy, creating more jobs
- Over 25% expended
