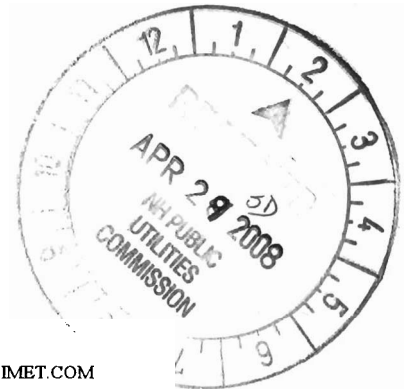

Re: DT 06-067 Freedom Ring Communications, LLC d/b/a BayRing Communications
Complaint Against Verizon New Hampshire Regarding Access Charges

Dear Ms. Howland:

On April 28, 2008, Freedom Ring Communications, LLC d/b/a BayRing Communications, AT&T Corp. and One Communications (the "Competitive Carriers") filed a joint opposition to the motion for rehearing previously filed by Northern New England Telephone Operations LLC d/b/a FairPoint Communications-NNE ("FairPoint"). In that joint opposition, the Competitive Carriers argued as Item V commencing on page 14, that FairPoint's motion for rehearing was not timely filed. The argument was made without citation to a single case and is simply wrong. *See Petition of Ellis*, 138 N.H. 159, 160 (1993) (Supreme Court citing *RSA 541:3* and *Sup.Ct.R. 27(1)* and holding that "...in computing time, when last day is a Sunday the period shall extend until end of next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday."). In fact, *Ellis* confirms what has been basic New Hampshire law for many years. *See e.g., H I K Corporation v. Manchester*, 103 N.H. 378, 381 (1961).
