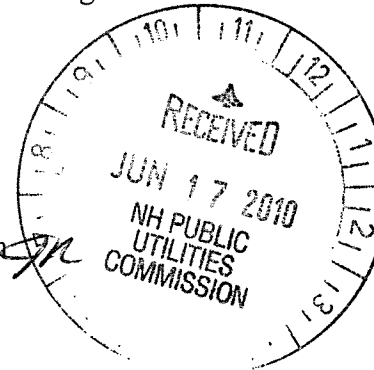

Summary

On May 17, 2010, New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, Inc. (NHEC) submitted an application on behalf of homeowner Debra L. Clough requesting that the Commission grant approval of her photovoltaic facility located at her residence to produce Class II Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law. Pursuant to RSA 362-F:4, II, Class II eligibility requires that a facility produce electricity from solar technologies and that it began operation after January 1, 2006.

Pursuant to RSA 362-F, the Commission, in a non-adjudicative process, is required to issue a determination of whether a facility meets a particular classification within 45 days of receipt of a completed application. The Debra L. Clough facility is a customer-sited photovoltaic rooftop array that began operation on December 1, 2009. The facility meets the Class II eligibility requirements under RSA 362-F:4, II. Based on its review of the application, Staff recommends that the Commission approve the facility as eligible for Class II RECs effective May 17, 2010.

Analysis

The facility is a customer-sited photovoltaic rooftop array located in Grafton, New Hampshire that began operation on December 1, 2009.¹ The facility has a gross nameplate capacity of 2.4 kilowatts.

Pursuant to the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08, the applicant is required to submit a complete list of the equipment used at the facility and certain information regarding the installer, seller and the independent monitor. The application includes a list of equipment purchased from Northeast Renewables, LLC and installed by Master Electrician, Peter Hadlock. The New England Independent System Operator asset identification number is not applicable as the facility is a customer-sited source. Since the facility is a customer-sited source, its output is not recorded in the New England Power Pool (NEPOOL) Market Settlement System and, as a result, the facility's output must be monitored and verified by an independent monitor pursuant to Puc 2505. The application identifies NHEC as the independent monitor. The Commission granted NHEC such status on May 12, 2009 in DE 09-006.

On April 9, 2010, the Commission also granted NHEC the authority to aggregate customer-sited sources pursuant to Puc 2506. See DE 10-060. Therefore, in addition to reporting this source's output to the Commission, NHEC will include the output of this facility when it reports the total output of all of its Class II eligible facilities, under the name *NHEC Class II Aggregation*, to the NEPOOL Generation Information System.

The applicant is also required to provide a copy of the interconnection agreement, proof that the applicant's distribution utility approved the installation and a signed attestation that the facility meets applicable building codes. NHEC provided a copy of the approved interconnection agreement with the facility and a signed attestation that it, as the distribution utility, approves the installation of the facility. The application also included a signed attestation that was originally provided to NHEC indicating that the project was installed and operating in conformance with any applicable building codes. Staff recommends that the Commission find the signed attestation meets Puc 2505.08 (b) (7) and (8).

Recommendation

Staff has reviewed NHEC's application for the Debra L. Clough facility located at her residence and can affirm it is complete pursuant to Puc 2505.08. Staff recommends that the Commission certify the Debra L. Clough facility as being eligible for Class II RECs effective May 17, 2010, the date on which Staff was able to make a determination that the facility meets the requirements for certification as a Class II renewable energy source.

¹ NHEC considers the operation date disclosed above, and in Appendix E of the application, to be the date on which NHEC inspected the facility and installed a revenue quality meter to record the electricity that will be eligible for Class II RECs. The date listed in the interconnection application pertains to the installation and interconnection of the facility and may be different than the operation date stated above.
