Enclosed please find the original and six copies of the Supplemental Direct Testimony of Stephen R. Hall and Frederick White with attachments in the above captioned proceeding. On September 23, 2011, Public Service Company of New Hampshire ("PSNH" or "the Company") filed a petition requesting approval of Alternative Default Energy Service Rate ADE along with the Direct Testimony and exhibits from Messrs. Hall and White. That testimony explained that an initial proposed rate could not be computed until the wet flue gas desulfurization system (scrubber) at Merrimack Station had been placed into service. The scrubber has been placed into service effective September 28, 2011. In a contemporaneous filing with the Commission today, PSNH is filing the Joint Testimony of Robert A. Baumann and William H. Smagula in which they explain the startup of the scrubber and the declaration of the project as in service.

PSNH has included the non-operating costs of the scrubber in its initially proposed Rate ADE of 7.86 cents per kilowatt-hour. PSNH is not requesting this rate be approved at this time. PSNH will update the request when more recent data on forward market prices are known closer to the date of the hearing on the merits.
