Hi Gary,

My company, Americas' wood company has applied to New Hampshire PUC for class II Renewable energy credits.

The excess energy portion of our production seems to be eligible for RECs because we are in the Central Maine Power service area. NH PUC requires that there be a monitor to verify the production of that energy. I understand that Central Maine Power does not offer this service. In lieu of any entity that can provide us that service, we believe a solution might be to obtain that information from your meter that measures revenue grade out feed power production.

Is it possible for you to provide me with a report that shows our production that has been recorded on that meter over a twelve month period?

We have requested to become eligible to receive New Hampshire RECs we produce from our 25Kw solar array in Washington Maine.

I had talked to you last week in regards to class II New Hampshire RECs. As you may recall I was requesting base line information about how to establish a method of production verification and monitoring, and whether it was your feeling that Central Maine Power could ask as a third party monitor. I considered this to be an informal request of information. I had mentioned our conversation in an E-mail I sent to Barbara Bernstein at NHPUC. The attached letter from NHPUC references my contact with you. They attempted to verify that communication.
