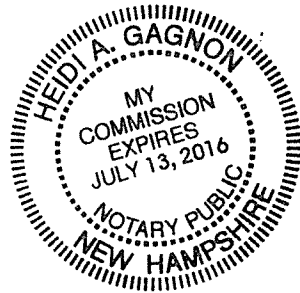

NOTIFICATION OF AQUATIC TREATMENT

Otter Lake - Greenfield, NH

Aquatic Control Technology, 11 John Road, Sutton, MA 01590, Telephone (508) 865-1000, has been contracted by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services to chemically treat portions of Otter Lake in Greenfield for control of non-native milfoil. Portions will be treated with the USEPA/State registered herbicide Sculpin G (2,4-D) herbicide, EPA Registration Number 67690-49 on or about Tuesday, June 18, 2013, in accordance with Special Permit SP-094 issued by the NH Division of Pesticide Control.

The following temporary water use restrictions will be imposed on the day of treatment:

- No swimming for 24 hours following treatment, within 200 feet of treated areas.
- Do not use this water for drinking, irrigation or for mixing sprays for agricultural or ornamental plants until further notice. Some irrigation restrictions may be relaxed, as per the pesticide label, at the discretion of the applicator. These restrictions apply to all intakes within 1,200 feet of the treatment area, and to all wells within 50 feet of the treatment area. USDA Forest Service, White Mountain National Forest, 30-Day Comment Period

The Androscoggin Ranger District of the White Mountain National Forest is seeking public review and comments on a proposal to install a 9 panel solar array on a single-pole mount located on National Forest System Land at the Godfrey Dam public water supply managed under special use permit issued to the Berlin Water Works (BWW), located in the City of Berlin, Coos County, New Hampshire. This project is part of an ongoing effort by the BWW to reduce operating costs and use of fossil fuels in an effort to be responsible for a clean environment.

This decision is expected to be an activity that can be categorically excluded from documentation in an environmental impact statement or environmental assessment pursuant to 36 CFR 220.6(e)(3): Approval, modification, or continuation of minor special uses of NFS lands that require less than five contiguous acres of land.

In accordance with the Sequoia Forestkeeper v. Tidwell court ruling, this project is subject to public notice, comment, and opportunity for administrative appeal. This is the formal notice of the 30-day public comment period. Comments concerning this project must be post-marked or received within 30 calendar days following the publication of this notice in the New Hampshire Union Leader. The publication date in the New Hampshire Union Leader is the exclusive means for calculating the comment period. Individuals and organizations wishing to be eligible to appeal this decision must provide their name, address, comments, and signature (or other verification of identity upon request) during this 30-day comment period.

Summary of Order Nisi Granting Licenses June 6, 2013

NOTICE OF ORDER NO. 25,518

On April 27, 2012, New Hampshire Optical Systems, Inc. (NHOS) filed petitions pursuant to RSA 371:17 requesting licenses to construct and maintain fiber optic communications cables over and across (1) the public waterway of the Israel River in Lancaster, New Hampshire; (2) the New Hampshire Central Railroad located parallel to Littleton Road in the vicinity of Union Street in Whitefield, New Hampshire; and (3) the New Hampshire Central Railroad near the junction of Jefferson Road and King Square in Whitefield, New Hampshire. The railroad crossings are over and across properties acquired by the State of New Hampshire and are also subject to RSA 373:1-a. According to the petitions, each proposed crossing will be placed between existing utility poles in existing public rights-of-way.

The petitions and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, are posted to the Commission's website at <http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2012/12-112.html>.

Staff reviewed the petitions and subsequently filed a memorandum stating that the proposed construction and designs conform to applicable sections of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC). Staff recommended approval of NHOS's petition, subject to certain conditions related to ensuring the safe construction, operation and maintenance of the proposed crossings and related attachments.

Based on the information presented in NHOS's petitions and Staff's memorandum, the Commission finds that the proposed crossings are necessary for NHOS to meet the reasonable requirements of reliable service to the public and that the requested licenses may be exercised without substantially affecting the public rights in the affected waters and lands, as required for approval under RSA 371:20. The petitions are therefore approved on a *nisi* basis.

NHOS is authorized by order *nisi* to construct, maintain and operate fiber optic and other lines over and across the public waters and state-owned railroad properties described in its petitions and depicted in its filings. All persons interested in responding to this Order *Nisi* may submit their comments or file a written request for a hearing which states the reason and basis for a hearing no later than June 21, 2013 for the Commission's consideration; and any party interested in responding to such comments or request for hearing shall do so no later than June 28, 2013. The Order *Nisi* shall be effective July 5, 2013, unless the Commission orders otherwise.
