ORDER NO. 25,410

On September 5, 2012, Concord Steam Corporation (Concord Steam) filed with the Commission a petition for an increase in its annual revenue requirement of \$862,584, or 21 percent. Concord Steam indicates that this increase comprises two rate components: (1) a \$549,600 increase to be recovered through distribution rates; and (2) a \$312,984 increase to be recovered through the Cost of Energy rate. The distribution rate increase would be spread proportionally among the three tiers of Concord Steam's declining block rate structure. In addition, the petition seeks temporary rates equal to the distribution rate increase (of \$549,600) for service rendered on and after November 1, 2012. (Concord Steam's petition for temporary rates has one isolated reference to an increase in the amount of \$507,713, a likely typographical error). Also, the petition seeks waivers of certain filing requirements of N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 1604,01(a).

Concord Steam states that during the test year ending December 31, 2011, it earned a return of negative 6%. According to Concord Steam, the low return is due to its declining sales, coupled with the effects of inflation on Concord Steam's operating and maintenance costs. If its proposal were adopted, Concord Steam's block rates would change as follows:

Concord Steam proposes a rate of return of 6.00%, substantially below its 8.41% weighted cost of capital as calculated by Concord Steam based on its current capital structure, and a return on equity of 9.75%. The proposed rate of return reflects Concord Steam's expectation that it will be able to reduce costs and lower rates when it begins purchasing its steam needs from Concord Power and Steam at the end of 2013. In support of its petition for temporary rates, Concord Steam contends that because the significant majority of its steam sales are in the winter heating months, postponing a rate increase during the course of the upcoming 2012-2013 winter heating season would aggravate its underearning position. Therefore, Concord Steam contends that its temporary rates ought to be set at the level of its permanent rate request.

RSA 378:6 provides that pending any investigation of a rate schedule which represents a general rate increase, the Commission may suspend the taking effect of such a tariff filling for up to 12 months in order to investigate whether the proposed rates are just, reasonable and otherwise consistent with applicable law. We determine that such suspension and investigation are necessary under RSA 378.6.

The filling raises, inter alia, issues related to whether the proposed permanent rates are just, reasonable, and lawful pursuant to RSA 378:7; whether the proposed rates yield a reasonable return on the cost of Concord Steam's property that is prudent as well as used and useful in the public service pursuant to RSA 378:27 and RSA 378:28, whether the rate design and rate of return proposed by Concord Steam are fair and equitable and allow for continued sa

sion; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.15, and hearing on the petition for emporary distribution rates be held before the Commission located at 11 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on October 23, 2012 at 10:00 a.m., at which each party will provide a preliminary statement of its position with regard to the petition and any of the noticed issues, including the matter of temporary rates; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that Concord Steam, the Staff of the Commission and any interested parties hold a Technical Session at the Commission on October 4, 2012 at 9:00 am. to review the petition and allow 2000 concord Steam to provide any amendments or judgates to its filling.
