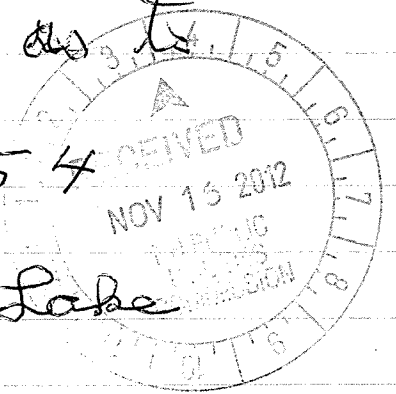

1. The Forest Edge Water proposal to increase its allowed quarterly rates by 4.14% would amount to a devastating burden to my wife and I who receive & try to pay our bills from our Social Security checks



2. For many years our annual costs for water service was \$200.00 and now the son of the original developer has increased the annual costs to \$11584 \$463.96 with approval of the N. H. PUE.

3. We reside in a 30 lot subdivision known as Forest Edge II which consists of 28 or 29 homes.

4. As to the previous rate case

OW 08-160 we were not notified of same until Robert

DeFeyter mentioned it to us when

I inquired about the increase in rates.

5. Apparently Kate Sullivan acquired the water Co upon the death of her father Joseph Sullivan at zero cost.
6. Throughout the many years we have lived here there have been many problem of service, ~~contaminated~~ water and small water lines that the Forest Edge water Co, Joseph Sullivan & or Kate Sullivan did not know where they were, together with 0 fire hydrants.
7. Our incoming water lines lie under or very close to our septic system which must be changed for our health.

8. For years I thought the incoming water came from the water lines in the street as installed & maintained by the water Co. I ^{DISCOVERED} ~~discovered~~ this was noticed on the engineer report & septic system permit & map.

9 Our homeowner fire policy is sky high as to other Company prices due to lack of fire hydrants.

10 Additionally for years the Forest Edge water Co stated they had 58 Customers and now it is evident the POC includes income from only 38 customers, This increases

our costs as 463,36 times
