## Summary

On February 27, 2014, the Commission received an application from Knollwood Energy of MA, LLC<sup>1</sup> (Knollwood Energy) requesting Class II New Hampshire Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) eligibility for Plowshare Farm, Inc.'s (Plowshare Farm) photovoltaic (PV) array pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Electric Renewable Portfolio Standard law.<sup>2</sup> Certification of the Plowshare Farm PV array will enable Knollwood Energy to add this facility to its aggregation pursuant to Puc 2506.01.

The Commission, in a non-adjudicative process, is required to issue a determination of whether a facility meets a particular classification within 45 days of receipt of a completed application. The above-named facility is a customer-sited source and meets the Class II eligibility requirements under RSA 362-F:4, II. Based on review of the application Staff recommends Commission approval for Plowshare Farm as an eligible Class II facility to be included in the Knollwood Energy aggregation, effective as of February 27, 2014.

#### Analysis

To qualify as a REC eligible facility, Puc 2505.08 (b) requires the source to provide the following information:

The application states that Paul Button, Energy Audits Unlimited will monitor the output of this facility and will report the facility's output quarterly to the NEPOOL Generation Information System and annually to the customer and the Commission as part of the Knollwood Energy's Class II aggregation pursuant to N.H. Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2505.08 and 2505.09.

#### Recommendation

Staff has reviewed the application for the Plowshare Farm PV array and participation in the Knollwood Energy aggregation and can affirm it is complete pursuant to Puc 2505.08. Staff has determined that this facility meets the requirements for certification as a Class II renewable energy source. Further, Staff recommends Commission approval for the Plowshare Farm as an eligible Class II facility to be included in the Knollwood Energy aggregation, effective as of February 27, 2014.
