an Independent Monitor

Dear Mr. Davis:

On July 23, 2014, Ground Energy Support LLC (Ground Energy Support), through its principal John Matthew Davis, filed an application to serve as an independent monitor for geothermal useful thermal energy. On September 3, 2014, Mr. Davis provided proof of his certification as an IGSHPA accredited installer. The IGSHPA certification is an acceptable qualification to serve as an independent monitor of useful thermal geothermal energy production, pursuant to proposed Puc 2505.09, as contemplated by Order No. 25,678 (June 19, 2014) issued in Docket No. DRM 14-095.

Staff has reviewed the application, found it to be complete, and stated that it meets the requirements for certification inasmuch as Mr. Davis is IGSHPA certified. Based on Staff's recommendation, the Commission has determined that the application meets the requirements for Mr. Davis to be certified as an independent monitor of useful thermal energy production, pursuant to the proposed Puc 2505.09.

Independent monitors in the State of New Hampshire are subject to the following specific requirements:

- The independent monitor shall not receive compensation for monitoring services that is a function of the number of certificates issued to any source using the independent monitor. Proposed Puc 2505.09(j).

- No customer-sited source or source producing useful thermal energy shall use an independent monitor who:
 - is a member of the immediate family of the owner of the source;
 - holds a direct or indirect ownership interest in the source; or,
 - who sold or installed the equipment used by the source. Proposed Puc 2505.09(g).

The duties of the independent monitor of useful thermal energy production shall be:

- To perform an initial inspection of the source's meters for accuracy and capability to measure the useful thermal energy produced, unless the meter is owned by a distribution utility that has already inspected it pursuant to Puc 305;
- To measure quarterly the source's useful thermal energy production used to qualify for certificates pursuant to the GIS operating rules; and,
- To report the production of useful thermal energy from the source and the REC calculation to the customer and the GIS quarterly in accordance with the GIS operating rules. Proposed Puc 2505.09(i).

An independent monitor shall also provide the Commission with notice prior to discontinuing services as an independent monitor. Proposed Puc 2505.09(k). If you have any questions regarding these provisions, please contact the Commission.
