The 2015 Public Service Company of New Hampshire Restructuring and Rate Stabilization Agreement ("2015 Agreement") approved by the Commission in the above-referenced docket includes Section III. G. titled "Exogenous Events". That Section requires Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource") to annually file a certification of exogenous events relating to the prior calendar year. More particularly, that Section states that Eversource:

will be allowed upon Commission approval to adjust distribution rates upward or downward as a result of Exogenous Events, as defined below. For any of the events defined as State Initiated Cost Change, Federally Initiated Cost Change, Regulatory Cost Reassignment, or Externally Imposed Accounting Rule Change PSNH will be allowed to adjust distribution rates upward or downward (to the extent that the revenue impact of such event is not otherwise captured through another rate mechanism that has been approved by the Commission) if the total distribution revenue impact (positive or negative) of all such events exceeds \$1,000,000 (Exogenous Events Rate Adjustment Threshold) in any calendar year beginning with 2015, until PSNH's next general distribution rate case.

# Certification of Exogenous Events Calendar Year 2019

#### I. Introduction

The 2015 Public Service Company of New Hampshire Restructuring and Rate Stabilization Agreement ("2015 Agreement") approved by the Commission in the docket referenced above includes Section III. G. titled "Exogenous Events" which states that Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource"):

will be allowed upon Commission approval to adjust distribution rates upward or downward as a result of Exogenous Events, as defined below. For any of the events defined as State Initiated Cost Change, Federally Initiated Cost Change, Regulatory Cost Reassignment, or Externally Imposed Accounting Rule Change PSNH will be allowed to adjust distribution rates upward or downward (to the extent that the revenue impact of such event is not otherwise captured through another rate mechanism that has been approved by the Commission) if the total distribution revenue impact (positive or negative) of all such events exceeds \$1,000,000 (Exogenous Events Rate Adjustment Threshold) in any calendar year beginning with 2015, until PSNH's next general distribution rate case.

In that Eversource has filed a distribution rate case, docketed by the Commission as Docket No. DE 19-057, the obligation for continued exogenous events filings appears to have been terminated. Eversource has included the impact of any previously identified state or federal initiated cost changes that are considered exogenous events in the general distribution rate

filing that began with the notice of intent to file temporary rate schedules on March 22, 2019 for effect July 1, 2019.

Therefore, Eversource has determined that there are no exogenous events to report in 2019 related specifically to Section III.G that would trigger a rate adjustment in accordance with the 2015 Agreement.
