"Comes now Public Service Company of New Rampshire, a corporation organized under the laws of The State of New Rampshire, and having its principal place of business in Manchester, New Hampshire, engaged is the generation, distribution and sale of electric energy to the public in Manchester and elsewhere in The State of New Hampshire, and respectfully represents to this Cosmission as follows:

- (1) In order to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public, it is necessary for the Company to construct one or more lines for the transdiscion of electric energy between the City of Franklin, New Esspahire, and he Town of Woodstock, New Esspahire.
- (2) The Company is informed and believes and therefore alleges that Lulu . Sanborn, Aimee Truelsen and Doris Byan of 590 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn, lew York, are the owners of a certain tract of land in the City of Franklin, more particularly described in deed of Calvin T. Call to Minnie Truelsen, ated August 22, 1913, recorded in Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, Book 413, Page 222, and more particularly described therein as follows:

A certain tract of land with the buildings thereon, situated in said Franklia bounded and described as follows, to with mortherly by land of Charles and Harry Colby; easterly by the land now or late of Hathaniel M. Colby and Thomas W. Call; southerly by the land of the said Mathaniel M. Colby and land now or late of Sarah Prebble and westerly by the land of Lester G. and Ella Maxfield. The above described premises contain 150 acres more or less.

(3) The Company desires to sequire a right of way One Hundred Twenty-five (125) feet in width across a portion of the premises described in the preceding paragraph, said One Bundred Twenty-five (125) foot strip to be Seventy-five (75) feet westerly and Fifty (50) feet easterly of a line described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the wire feace marking the ensterly boundary line of land of Lulu T. Samborn et al at land of Everett Milton, said point of beginning being 404 feet measured easterly along said feace from the northeasterly side of the road leading to the head of Webster Lake, thence running North 45° W, a distance of 545 feet to a point in the wire feace marking the northerly boundary line of land of Lulu T. Samborn et al at land of City of Franklin.

(4) The Company is unable to agree with said Lulu T. Samborn, lines Truelsen and Boris Syan as to the necessity of said right of way, or as to the price to be paid therefor.

WHEREFORE, Public Service Company of New Hampshire praye:

- (1) That the Commission grant it permission to take the right of way as above set forth in paragraph 3;
- (2) That the Commission determine the price to be said for said right of way.
