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1	PROCEEDING
2	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: We're here this
3	morning in Docket DG 16-294, which is Concord
4	Steam Corporation's Petition for a Permanent
5	Rate Increase. We suspended the tariffs that
6	had been filed for investigation and scheduled
7	a prehearing conference for today, which is I
8	thought the reason why we were going to be
9	here, but it appears we're not.
10	Who would like to put on the record
11	the reason that there's not going to be a
12	prehearing conference this morning?
13	Ms. Geiger.
14	MS. GEIGER: Yes. Thank you,
15	Chairman Honigberg. Susan Geiger, from the law
16	firm of Orr & Reno, representing Concord Steam
17	Corporation. I filed an appearance yesterday.
18	As indicated in the Commission's
19	Order of Notice, the Company was to have
20	published the Order of Notice by May 20th.
21	Unfortunately, through accident, mistake or
22	misfortune, that task fell through the cracks.
23	And, so, the Order of Notice on the filing was
24	not published.

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In light of that, the Company would 1 2 request that this hearing be suspended or 3 delayed, and that we resume at some point in the future, in the near future, because I 4 5 guess, fortunately, the Company is going to be revising its filing. And, so, it really 6 7 doesn't make sense to publish the Order of Notice that reflects rates that are going to be 8 9 superseded or updated, if you will, due to new 10 events. 11 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I got ahead of 12 myself and should have taken appearances. 13 Ms. Geiger entered her appearance orally, and I 14 know we got the written filing yesterday. 15 Mr. Speidel, you want to identify 16 yourself and your team there? 17 MR. SPEIDEL: Yes. Alexander 18 Speidel, representing the Staff of the 19 Commission. And I have Director Mark Naylor of 20 the Gas and Water Division, Assistant Director 21 Steve Frink of the Gas and Water Division, and 22 Assistant Director Robert Wyatt of the Safety 23 Division. 24 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: So, Mr. Speidel,

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1 any comment on Ms. Geiger's statements in how 2 we should proceed? 3 MR. SPEIDEL: Staff thinks that that 4 is a reasonable way to proceed. We will expect 5 that the Company will submit some sort of 6 revised rate filing in the near future. It may 7 implicate either a revision of the current filing or perhaps a withdrawal of one filing 8 and a substitution of another. But we'll just 9 10 see how events shake out over the next few 11 weeks. 12 And we would expect that this hearing 13 is nonoperative under the Administrative 14 Procedures Act of New Hampshire and that no 15 substantive business should be handled. 16 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I think that's Just I guess I would comment that, to 17 correct. 18 the extent that there are statutory deadlines associated with the suspension of the tariffs 19 20 that were filed, we need to make sure that we 21 are mindful of those, and that, if withdrawals 22 are appropriate, to avoid triggering something 23 that shouldn't be triggered. I would hope 24 counsel would work that out and we'll be able

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to go forward from there. All right. With that, we will leave you. I think no other business can be done because of the failure of notice. And we'll adjourn. Thank you. MS. GEIGER: Thank you. (Whereupon the non-prehearing conference was adjourned at 9:05 a.m.) 

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
