We're interested in finding 18 out what areas of inquiry the Staff has 19 particularly identified. We're looking forward 20 to the technical session following the 21 prehearing conference. 22 And we have every reason to suppose 23 that this docket can be resolved efficiently, expeditiously, and in a manner that is fair to 24
