On behalf of Liberty Utilities (EnergyNorth Natural Gas) Corp. d/b/a Liberty Utilities, and to substantially lessen the amount of confidential information in the Company's filing in this docket, enclosed please find seven confidential copies and one public copy of a replacement filing for Bates 071 through Bates 216 of the Company's initial filing in the above docket (numbered Bates 071R through Bates 216R in this replacement filing) as listed below:

- Pre-Filed Direct Testimony of Timothy S. Lyons (Bates 071R through 096R), with attachments (Bates 097R through 108R); and
- Pre-Filed Direct Testimony of William R. Killeen and James M. Stephens (Bates 109R through 216R).

The only change to these replacement documents is a reduction in the material for which the Company seeks confidential treatment. The underlying text, figures, and charts are unchanged. The material that remains shaded in the confidential versions or redacted in the public versions of this replacement filing is still subject to the *Motion for Confidential Treatment* that the Company filed on December 22, 2017.

The Company files replacement pages for all documents at Bates 071 through 216, rather than just the pages that changed, for ease of reference as this case goes forward. The Company did not include replacement filings for Bates 001 through 070 (the Fleck/DaFonte testimony and attachments), and for Bates 217 through 635 (the attachments to the Killeen/Stephens testimony) because those pages are unchanged, they are voluminous, and they can still be easily referenced without confusion.
