Withdrawal of Petition

Dear Director Howland:

This letter is to inform you that Enel X, the petitioner in this matter, withdraws its petition in this matter.

Two and a half years ago, in DE 17-113 and the present docket, Enel X involved itself in the New Hampshire electric market because with Eversource's divestiture of its generation assets, New Hampshire was ripe for Enel X's type of services. As the Commission is aware, Enel X is already involved in the northeast regional energy market through the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative. Enel X has been before the Commission explaining its services and track record of savings. All the while, Enel X's business opportunities and commitments have continued to expand elsewhere. Given these commitments and that the parties involved have not demonstrated support for switching procurement methods in Eversource's New Hampshire service territory, Enel X has reassessed its energies and has decided to cease litigation. Enel X apologizes for the timing of this notification in light of next week's hearing, but Enel X wanted to personally speak with the Office of the Consumer Advocate, Eversource, and Staff before publicly filing this letter.

Enel X will continue to work cooperatively with energy service providers with the hope that in the future, when Enel X has an active supporting partner, it will reapproach the New Hampshire Commission to approve use of its services at that time.

Enel X sincerely thanks the Commission for its time and review to date. Thank you in advance for your assistance with the closure of this docket.
