P R O C E E D I N G

2 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning,
3 everyone. We are here in Docket DRM 18-152,
4 which is a rulemaking proceeding regarding the
5 Puc 3000 rules that govern competitive natural
6 gas suppliers and aggregators. This is a
7 readoption process of existing rules, with some
8 changes.

9 Today we're here for a public comment
10 hearing. All of you will have to take turns.

11 Mr. Wiesner, would you please set the
12 scene for us.

13 MR. WIESNER: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
14 Thank you.

15 These supplier rules, gas supplier
16 rules would have expired if we had not begun
17 this process. This is a process to readopt
18 those rules. We've taken the opportunity to
19 include a number of amendments, many of which
20 are intended to make these rules consistent
21 with the rules that were adopted last year for
22 electric suppliers, competitive electric power
23 suppliers.

24 And there are also changes that were

1 made to reflect recent statutory amendments
2 regarding the protection of individual privacy,
3 individual customer information deemed private
4 in the legislation.

5 So, it's a pretty complete set of
6 rules. It would not be surprising to those
7 suppliers who are active in both the electric
8 and the gas field, and that may be one of the
9 reasons we have a very limited turnout today.

10 There is an opportunity for parties
11 to file written comments as well by
12 December 14th. And we will hopefully receive
13 some comments, reflect those comments in a
14 final proposal, which will then be filed for
15 consideration by the Joint Legislative
16 Committee on Administrative Rules.

17 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Thank you,
18 Mr. Wiesner.

19 Only one member of the public is
20 here, but she indicated that she did not wish
21 to speak. Is that true? Is that correct?

22 MS. CHAPUT: Yes. That's correct.

23 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. So,
24 we have no members of the public who wish to

1 provide oral comments.

2 As Mr. Wiesner noted, we have set a
3 deadline for written submissions of
4 December 14th.

5 I'm not sure there's anything else
6 for us to do, Mr. Wiesner?

7 MR. WIESNER: I think that covers it,
8 Mr. Chairman.

9 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. With
10 that, we will adjourn the public comment
11 hearing. Thank you all.
