I am currently renting out of an apartment in Merrimack, NH and have never experienced such exorbitant delivery rates than through the Eversource energy company. I have lived in many apartments in the past, and no energy bill rate has come close to what Eversource is charging for their delivery rates. Their rates are well over 100% the actual supply rate. What is worse, I have no other option to select for energy delivery other than Eversource - they have me as a captive consumer and can ultimately charge anything they would like. I would like to submit this picture of my most recent energy bill with the corresponding supply and delivery rates and costs from Eversource, into the public record. In this energy bill which was posted for the 1 month period of August to September 2020, the delivery costs was 175% of the supply cost. How is this fair price? Thank you.
