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## PROCEEDING

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CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: We're here this afternoon in Docket DW 20-071 for a prehearing conference regarding the Atkinson Area Wastewater Recycling, Incorporated, request for change in rates.

I need to make the necessary findings, because this is a remote hearing.

As the Chairwoman of the Public
Utilities Commission, I find that due to the
State of Emergency declared by the Governor as a
result of the COVID-19 pandemic, and in
accordance with the Governor's Emergency Order
Number 12, pursuant to Executive Order 2020-04,
this public body is authorized to meet
electronically. Please note that there is no
physical location to observe and listen
contemporaneously to this hearing, which was
authorized pursuant to the Governor's Emergency
Order.

However, in accordance with the

Emergency Order, I am confirming that we are

utilizing Webex for this electronic hearing. All

members of the Commission have the ability to

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         communicate contemporaneously during this
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         hearing, and the public has access to
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         contemporaneously listen and, if necessary,
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         participate.

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                   MR. AUGERI: Nice to meet you, too.
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                   CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: All right. And
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         Attorney Schwarzer. And I think you're on mute.
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                   MS. SCHWARZER: Good morning -- good
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         afternoon, I guess, Madam Chair and
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         Commissioners. I am Mary Schwarzer. Staff
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         attorney with the PUC, representing Commission
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         Staff. With me is the Assistant Director of
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         Water and Gas, Jayson Laflamme.
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                   CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: Okay. Thank you.
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                   And, for preliminary matters, I have
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that we have a pending Motion for Confidential 1 2. Treatment. And, for purposes of today, we will 3 treat the information that's the subject of that 4 motion as confidential and issue a written order 5 on that later. Does anyone need to be heard on that or 7 are there any other preliminary matters? MR. AUGERI: Madam Commissioner, we do 9 not. We rely on the filings and papers submitted. 10 11 CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: Okay. Thank you. 12 All right. If there are no other -- oh, Attorney 1.3 Schwarzer, go ahead. You're on mute. 14 MS. SCHWARZER: Thank you, Madam 15 Chairwoman. 16 I wanted to bring to the Commission's 17 attention that Attorney Augeri filed some 18 additional documents into the record today 19 showing letters sent to particular clients for 20 notice, consist with the order suspending the 21 tariff, to comply with the requirement. 2.2 CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: Okay. Thank you. 23 All right. Why don't we take initial 24 positions then, starting with Attorney Schwarzer.

MS. SCHWARZER: Okay. Am I unmuted? Thank you. I wanted to give the Commission a little background on this particular docket.

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AAWW filed a petition in 2007 for approval of acquisition of assets, financing, and the establishment of permanent rates. And it was resolved by a Stipulation Agreement among the parties, and approved by the Commission in Order 24,899, in September of 2008. That was docket 07-131.

Atkinson Heights, which is a proposed 55+
condominium development of nine buildings and 32
units each, was prospective at the time. And, to
date, no condominiums have been built. In
addition, in 2007, AAWW, it was their first
establishment of rates, and therefore it deviated
from the historical test year method.

The substantive matters that Staff and the parties will address in this current docket include standard rate case matters. Are the rates just, reasonable, lawful? Was there an appropriate return on investment? Were the investments prudent and useful? There are also

some additional issues.

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As stated, AAWW continues to serve no residential customers. And they have one commercial customer, a country club and golf course, which is a closely held entity owned by related parties, who also own AAWW.

The prior rate order was based upon the Company's estimate that four out of the nine total approved buildings, 32 units each, or 128 residential customers total, would be paying residential rates. And, as stated, there are no residential ratepayers at this time. At present, there is one building under construction.

In this docket, the Company is proposing an annual base charge increase of 94.6 percent for the commercial and for the nonexistent residential customers. They are proposing a sewer consumption charge increase of 41.6 percent for both classes of customers.

Overall, their Petition says that they propose a permanent revenue increase of approximately \$56,000, and a percentage increase of 94 percent. That actual \$56,000 will come from the one commercial customer. It would break

down to \$979 approximately for each residential customer. Again, there are not any.

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So, Staff looks forward to learning more about the proposed increases as we investigate this docket in the tech session that's going to follow.

In the 2007 to 2008 rate proceeding, of necessity, the Company relied upon estimates.

But, now, with more than ten years of experience,

Staff anticipates that the estimates will provide

more substantial -- excuse me -- that AAWW will

provide more substantial support to explain its

stated need to increase the rates.

In this docket, temporary rates have not been requested. The Company is also asking that they be permitted to charge the Contribution in Aid of Construction, or CIAC tax, to the entity making the cash or asset contribution, and they also wish to reflect that change in their tariff.

I would like to note that AAWW has requested that the permanent revenue increase be effective as of December 1st, 2020. Staff does not feel that that timeframe is possible.

1 However, we anticipate handling the docket in a 2. timely and efficient matter. Early discussions 3 with the Company regarding a procedural schedule suggest the possibility of a hearing before the 4 5 Commission in early 2021. 6 So, in sum, we look forward to working 7 collaboratively with the Company to resolve the issues raised in this docket. 8 9 Thank you. 10 CHAIRWOMAN MARTIN: Okay. Thank you. 11 Attorney Augeri. 12 MR. AUGERI: Thank you, Madam 1.3 Chairwoman. Again, my name is Tony Augeri. the General Counsel for Atkinson Area Wastewater 14 15 Recycling, "AAWW" for short. 16 Attorney Schwarzer did a fine job of 17

the history and the background in this matter. I would just add, rather than repeat that, I'll just add in a few other items that relate to this, in terms of the background.

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Yes. This was approved, I believe, filed in '07 and approved in 2008. And one question or an area of questioning we may anticipate is "Why now?" And "Why didn't

something happen with regard to the residential construction before now?" And there was a number of factors, not the least of which was a extreme downturn in the economy at that time. But also, and perhaps even more striking to the Companies, was the death of Peter Lewis in May of 2008. And those two events really added to -- it caused a lot of, you know, this to be put on hold to until now.

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We are now under construction, nearly complete of the first building. And the frame-out, rough roof, and rough end work is almost complete. It is anticipated that we will -- we're targeting occupation in February of 2021 now. Originally, we were more optimistic that perhaps we could get in by December, which is why the Petition had asked for any rates that were approved by the Commission to be effective December 1st. And, as Attorney Schwarzer noted, and kindly provided a draft procedural schedule, that the Company has no objection to. And we look forward to speaking with Staff during the technical session that follows, and don't foresee any issues in scheduling in that regard.

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It has been thirteen years since the last rate case. There is a history of the commercial customer, which is the Atkinson Resort & Country Club. There is still no, although we have a better handle on the numbers for residential customers, they are still projections. So, we hope to flesh that out during the technical session, and look forward to doing so.

The filing itself, I guess to be kind, had some hiccups. And, today, even down to the pagination, which I missed, was just submitted, so that there's sufficient identification of each page submitted in the filing for the Staff and the Commission's ease of reference. And all I will say to that regard, is I apologize for that, those omissions. But it has been taken care of.

Finally, there was -- I will also take ownership to the notice that Attorney Schwarzer referenced to the known customers or known potential customers that was pursuant to the order that suspended the tariff of the Company. I perhaps misread it, to say -- to indicate that only the affidavit needed to be filed for the

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publication side, and not the letters to those, that were mailed to those two entities, which there was only two. I will confirm on the record now that there is only still one known customer.

And, in an abundance of caution, a known potential customer we identified as the developer, because the building is almost complete. So, both of those entities were provided notice.

Again, I did not send it by way of an affidavit, though that was just filed. But it was sent out and mailed, which I certified in the record, and do so right here, that it was done before the August 21st deadline within the Commission's order. And, in fact, both notices were mailed through the U.S. Postal Service on August 18th, 2020.

We have -- I would just also note, especially in regard to Attorney Schwarzer, we have been in active communication, which has been great. And we look forward to continuing those efforts with her and with the rest of Staff.

The only comment I would make on the submitted tariff is there was one other change,

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         besides the addition of the language to CIAC, in
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         addition to whichever, should the Commission
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         either reach settlement or otherwise on the
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         rates. And that is just a small change that
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         indicates that billing will be now done -- or,
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         we're seeking that the Commission approve to be
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         done on a monthly basis, rather than a quarterly
         basis.
                    We look forward to working with the
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         parties, and also participating in the technical
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         session to follow this prehearing. And do look
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         forward to, as back in 2007-2008, reaching a
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         settlement that can be presented to the
         Commission in due course.
