Dear Chairman Goldner:

The Commission "direct[ed] the Joint Utilities to confer with the parties in this matter and file a proposed procedural schedule by January 21, 2022." Order No. 26,560 at 20 (Jan. 7, 2022). The proposed schedule "should result in submission to the Commission of a Program Proposal for the remainder of the 2021–2023 triennium no later than March 31, 2022, for effect May 1, 2022 upon Commission approval." *Id.* The Order also stated that, "If the proposed procedural schedule is not assented to by all parties, objections to the proposed procedural schedule shall be filed no later than January 28, 2022." *Id.*

In compliance with the above directives, the Joint Utilities¹ propose the following procedural schedule:
