amount of total loan repayments received. Eversource is the only recipient of this PI since NHEC does not collect PI on its offerings under the SmartSTART program. Based on its history, the program has been successful and well-received within its target market of municipal customers for more than a decade. Given this success and the maturity of the program, Staff questions whether or not the separate PI for this program is still warranted. Moreover, staff is concerned that the separate PI for SmartSTART essentially amounts to a double-count of PI for Eversource since Eversource already benefits from earning an annual PI on the savings realized from the energy efficiency improvements funded by the program. Eversource earned \$51,957 in separate SmartSTART PI under this program in 2019 and \$26,358 as of mid-2020. Although the amounts are small when compared with the overall energy efficiency budget, the question remains as to whether this additional PI is still needed for a program that is fully established, mature, and functional. Accordingly, Staff recommends that the Commission either eliminate or phase-out the separate 6 percent PI for the SmartSTART program as part of its Order in this docket.

Q. Does that conclude your testimony?
