
Chair Goldner:

On April 30, 2021 Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy (“Eversource” or the “Company”) submitted its petition for recovery of storm expenses pertaining to storm events from October 2019 through May 2020. On July 15, 2022 the New Hampshire Department of Energy (“DOE”) recommended recovery of the requested storm expenses subject to certain adjustments assented to by the Company. On September 15, 2022, the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) issued an order *nisi*, Order No. 26,686 approving the amounts specified in the DOE’s recommendation. In the Order, the Commission required that “Eversource shall notify both the DOE and the Commission when the Company has determined the amount of appropriate carrying charges, and it shall confirm the amount of the recovery and balance of the MSCR fund.” Order No. 26,686 at 3.

By this letter, Eversource is informing the Commission and the DOE that the total amount of recovered costs is \$18,732,911, which reflects the balance of costs noted in Order No. 26,686 updated with the application of the appropriate carrying charges through September 15, 2022 as directed by that order. The balance of the MSCR fund was \$19,207,741 as of September 30, 2022.
