On behalf of Unitil Energy Systems, Inc. ("UES" or the "Company") I enclose UES's Annual Stranded Cost Recovery and External Delivery Charge Reconciliation and Rate filing. In support of the tariff changes requested, the filing includes the direct testimonies and schedules of Linda S. McNamara, Jeffrey M. Pentz, Daniel T. Nawazelski and Emily L. Anderson.

Proposed Tariff Changes

UES is proposing the following tariffs for effect August 1, 2024:

- Summary of Delivery Service Rates, Sixty-First Revised Page 4 and Sixtieth Revised Page 5
- Summary of Whole House Residential Time of Use Rates and Electric Vehicle Rates, Twelfth Revised Page 5-A
- Summary of Low-Income Electric Assistance Program Discounts, Eighty-Sixth Revised Page 6
- Calculation of the Stranded Cost Charge, Thirty-First Revised Page 65
- Calculation of the External Delivery Charge, Thirty-Third Revised Page 67

As noted in the enclosed testimony of Linda S. McNamara, these tariff pages include, where applicable, all proposed August 1, 2024 rates, including those currently pending in DE 24-065 and DE 24-077.

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T 603.617.2715 www.unitil.com The tariffs include the proposed Stranded Cost Charge and External Delivery Charge, which are supported by the enclosed testimony and schedules, and summarized in the table below:

<u>Class</u>	<u>Stranded Cost</u> <u>Charge</u>	External Delivery Charge
Residential	\$0.00013/kWh	\$0.02539/kWh
General Service	\$0.00013/kWh	\$0.02539/kWh
Large General Service	\$0.00013/kWh	\$0.02539/kWh
Outdoor Lighting	\$0.00013/kWh	\$0.02539/kWh

For customers taking Default Service, the average class bill impacts as a result of the proposed Stranded Cost Charge and External Delivery Charge, versus current rates, are an approximate 8.2 percent decrease for the residential class, 9.0 percent decrease for the general service classes, 12.5 percent decrease for the large general service class, and 4.8 percent decrease for the Outdoor lighting class.

Based on all proposed August 1, 2024 rate changes, for customers taking Default Service, the average class bill impacts versus current rates, are an approximate 9.0 percent decrease for the residential class, 9.7 percent decrease for the general service classes, and 4.9 percent decrease for the Outdoor lighting class. Based on changes to the delivery rates only, G1 average bills will increase approximately 12.6 percent.¹
