Puc 101.01 <u>Applicability</u>. This chapter shall apply to the conduct of all commission business in furtherance of the agency's statutory responsibilities.

Adopt Puc 101.01 to read as follows:

Puc 101.01 "Chairman" means the commission's presiding commissioner and administrative head, who is appointed under RSA 363:4 and possesses the powers and duties conferred under RSA 21-G:9.

Adopt Puc 101.02 to read as follows:

Puc 101.02 "Clerk's Ooffice" is means the office designated by the commission to receive all filings and to maintain the commission docket system.

Readopt with amendment and renumber Puc 102.02, effective 6-20-06 (Document #8656), as Puc 101.03 to read as follows:

Puc 1021.023 "Commission" means the public utilities commission of the State of New Hampshire, its commissioners and its employees established under RSA 363:1.

Adopt Puc 101.04 to read as follows:

Puc 101.04 "Commissioner" means a member of the commission appointed under RSA 363:3.

Readopt with amendment and renumber Puc 102.05, effective 6-20-06 (Document #8656), as Puc 101.05 to read as follows:

Puc 1021.05 "Customer" means any person, firm, <u>partnership</u>, corporation, cooperative marketing association, tenant, governmental unit, or subdivision of a municipality, or of the state of, or the State of *in* New Hampshire who has contracted for electric *furnished with electric transmission or distribution service, with or without default electric service, as well as*, gas, sewer, steam, telephone, or water service from *by* a *public* utility.

Adopt Puc 101.06 to read as follows:

Puc 101.06 "Department" means the New Hampshire <u>Dd</u>epartment of <u>eEnergy</u>.

Readopt with amendment and renumber Puc 102.06, effective 6-20-06 (Document #8656), as Puc 101.07 to read as follows:

Puc 1021.067 "Document" means any paper or electronic record, including but not limited to without *limitation,* any application, complaint, petition, motion, prepared testimony, date request, data response, exhibit, brief, written communication or correspondence. With respect to an electronic record, "document" does not include information that would not appear if the document were printed in paper form.

Adopt Puc 101.08 and Puc 101.09-to read as follows:

Puc 101.08 "Governmental authority" means the government of any nation, state, commonwealth, district, territory, county, district, city, town, locality, or other political subdivision thereof, any entity or body exercising

executive, legislative, judicial, regulatory, taxing, or administrative functions of or pertaining to government, including any court, quasi governmental authority, self regulatory organization, commission, tribunal, agency, or any political or other subdivision, department, board, bureau, or branch or any official of any of the foregoing.

Puc 101.098 "<u>Office of the consumer advocate (OCA)</u>" means the <u>Ooffice of the Consumer Aadvocate</u> established under RSA 36<u>32</u>:28.

Readopt with amendment and renumber Puc 102.11, effective 6-20-06 (Document #8656), as Puc 101.0910 to read as follows:

Puc 1021.1409 "Person" means any individual, partnership, *natural person*, corporation, *limited liability company, trust, joint venture*, association, *company, partnership, unincorporated organization*, *Ggg*overnmental subdivision. *Authority*, or public or private organization of any character which appears before the commission for any purpose, *other entity of any kind or character*.

Adopt Puc 101.110 and Puc 101.12 to read as follows:

Puc 101.11 "Public utility" is <u>means</u> an entity that provides utility services to customers and is regulated by the commission.

Puc 101.120 "Service Llist" is-means the list of personsentities entitled to receive notice of all filings and commission orders in a specific commission docket.

Change the part heading for Puc 102 to read as follows:

PART Puc 102 DESCRIPTION AND CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE COMMISSION.

Repeal Puc 102.01, effective 6-210-06 (Document #8656) as follows:

Puc 102.01 "Adjudicative proceeding" means a proceeding conducted pursuant to the procedure followed in contested cases, as set forth in RSA 541-A:31 through RSA 541-A:36 and the rules of the commission.

Adopt Puc 102.01 to read as follows:

Puc 102.01 General Description.

(a) The commission is an independent state agency comprised of a chairman, two commissioners, and staff members who report to the chairman. The commission exercises jurisdiction of matters as outlined in Puc 102.02 and Puc 204.01 and other responsibilities as delegated to it by the General Court.

Puc 102.042. Jurisdiction. The commission's jurisdiction shall includes include:

- (a) <u>T</u>the general supervision of the state's public utilities as <u>outlined by RSA 374:3</u>, facilities, and service <u>offerings</u>;
- (b) Aacting as the arbiter between the interests of public utilities and customers; and

(c) <u>Eensuring that the rates, fares, charges, and prices billed</u> to customers are just, reasonable, and lawful.

Adopt Puc 102.023 to read as follows:

Puc 102.023 Commission's Office and Business Hours.

(b) The commission's business hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding New Hampshire state holidays.

Repeal Puc 102.03, Puc 102.04, Puc 102.07 through Puc 102.10, and Puc 102.12 through Puc 102.18, effective 6-10-06 (Document #8656), as follows:

Puc 102.03 "Complaint" means a writing filed with the commission pursuant to RSA 365:1 which claims a public utility has acted or failed to act in violation of any law, rule, regulation, or order administered or promulgated by the commission.

Puc 102.04 "Contested case" means a proceeding in which the legal rights, duties, or privileges of a party are required by law to be determined by the commission after an opportunity for hearing.

Puc 102.07 "Hearing" means a properly noticed session held in a contested case before the commission or its designee which provides for opportunity for any party, intervenor or commission staff to present evidence and conduct cross examination. "Hearing" also includes any pre-hearing conferences conducted pursuant to Puc 203.14.

Puc 102.08 "Motion" means a request made to the commission or the presiding officer after the commencement of a contested proceeding for an order or ruling directing some act to be done in favor of the party making the motion, including a statement of justification or reasons for the request.

Puc 102.09 "Order" means the whole or part of the commission's disposition of a matter, other than a rule, but does not include a commission decision to initiate, postpone, investigate or process any matter.

Puc 102.10 "Party" means "party" as defined by RSA 541-A:1, XII, namely, "each person or agency named or admitted as a party, or properly seeking and entitled as a right to be admitted as a party."

Puc 102.12 "Petition" means the initial pleading filed with the commission to commence a proceeding for the purpose of seeking commission action pursuant to Puc 202.01(a).

Puc 102.13 "Prehearing conference" means a properly noticed session in contested cases which provides the opportunity, pursuant to RSA 541-A:31, V, to consider requests for intervention, offers of settlement, simplification of the issues, stipulations or admissions as to issues of fact or proof, limitations on the number of witnesses, changes to standard procedures during the hearing, or other matters which aid in the disposition of the proceeding.

Puc 102.14 "Prehearing order" means the commission's written decision addressing procedural issuesraised in a prehearing conference.

Puc 102.15 "Presiding officer" means the chairman of the commission except as provided in Puc 203.14(b)(c).

Puc 102.16 "Proceeding" means a docketed case commenced by the commission.

Puc 102.17 "Public statement hearing" means a meeting of the commission convened in an adjudicative

proceeding for the sole purpose of receiving public comment that will not be entered into evidence.

Puc 102.18 "Respondent" means any party subject to the commission's jurisdiction to whom the commission issues notice instituting a proceeding, or investigation or inquiry of the commission, or any party in interest or person ordered before any pending proceeding of the commission.

Repeal Puc 102.19, effective 3-24-12 (Document #10101), as follows:

Puc 102.19 "Routine filings" means documents submitted, on a recurrent basis, by a utility to the commission, and as specified in Puc 200.

Repeal Puc 102.20 through Puc 102.22, effective 6-10-06 (Document #8656), as follows:

Puc 102.20 "Rulemaking" means the process for adopting rules as provided for in RSA 541-A:3 and other relevant provisions of RSA 541-A.

Puc 102.21 "Staff" means the employees of the commission other than the commissioners.

Puc 102.22 "Technical session" means a meeting of the parties at which information is shared on an informal basis and at which neither the presiding officer nor any commissioners are present.

Repeal Puc 103, effective 6-10-06 (Document #8656), as follows:

PART Puc 103 DESCRIPTION AND CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE COMMISSION

Puc 103.01 Commission Functions.

(a) The commission is established to carry out the requirements of RSA Title XXXIV relative to public utilities and their customers and the requirements of RSA 38 relative to public utilities and municipalities.

(b) Pursuant to RSA 363:17-a, the commission serves as the arbiter between the interests of the eustomer and the interests of regulated utilities.

(c) Pursuant to RSA 374:3, the commission has the general supervision of all public utilities and their facilities so far as is necessary to carry out the requirements of RSA Title XXXIV.

(d) Pursuant to RSA 378, the commission has the responsibility to assure that rates charged by public utilities are just, reasonable and lawful.

(e) Pursuant to RSA 363:27, II, the commission shall organize its staff as it determines best achieves the commission's statutory responsibilities.

(f) Pursuant to RSA 363:27, III, the commission shall appoint an executive director and a general counsel.

(g) The staff of the commission is structured around industry specific divisions and includes divisions with expertise in electric, gas, telecommunications, water and all other types of utilities as set forth in RSA 362:2.

(h) In addition to the industry specific divisions noted in (g), the commission includes an administration division, a legal division, a safety division, an audit division and a consumer affairs division.

(i) The commission is located at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire.

(j) The commission has regular hours from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and is closed on Saturdays, Sundays and state holidays.

Puc 103.01 General Inquiries and Requests for Access to Records.

(a) General inquiries about the commission may be transmitted to the clerk's office at the address <u>and</u> <u>telephone number</u> specified in Puc 102.03(a).

(b) Any person requesting access to commission records under RSA chapter 91-A shall direct a request for access as specified in (c) below.

(c) A request to access commission records shall be in writing, and:

(1) Identify as particularly as possible the information being sought;

(2) Include a statement that the requestor agrees to pay a copying fee equal to the greater of the actual cost of providing the copy or \$0.25 per page, or an affirmative request that based on financial hardship the requested is asking for a waiver of the fee(s), if applicable; and

(3) Be transmitted to the clerk at the address specified in Puc 102.03(a).
