Petition Pursuant to RSA 362:4 and RSA 374:22 to Extend Water Service Area

# COMMENCEMENT OF ADJUDICATIVE PROCEEDING AND NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE

On October 1, 2024, the City of Laconia (Laconia) filed a petition requesting authorization to extend water service to 18 residential lots in Belmont, New Hampshire (Belmont Lots). In support of its petition, Laconia filed several attachments, which included plans showing the location of the Belmont Lots. #### I. BACKGROUND AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

In its petition, Laconia noted that both the Laconia City Council and the Town of Belmont approved the extension of water service to the Belmont Lots, which are located in an area that presently has no water service. Petition (Pet.), ¶¶ 3, 9; Exhibit 4. Laconia stated that its water system has sufficient capacity to provide this additional water service. *Id.*, ¶¶ 4, 8. As Exhibit 6 to its petition, Laconia filed a letter dated August 23, 2024 from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES), in which the NHDES also determined that Laconia's water system has capacity to expand its water service and "meets the suitability and availability criteria of NH RSA 374:22 III for expansion of water service into the Town of Belmont."

Laconia proposed providing water service to the Belmont Lots at a rate 15 percent higher than the rate it now charges for water service provided to Laconia residents. Pet., ¶¶ 6, 9. It represented that the owner and developer of the Belmont

Lots, Mountain Lake Village, LLC, will fund the extension of the water line, and the owners of the Belmont Lots would own the service lines from the curb stop to their residences, so that the costs of the extension would not be passed onto existing Laconia water customers. Id.,  $\P$  8; see also Exhibits 3 and 4. Laconia requested expedited review of its petition. Id.,  $\P$  9.

#### II. ISSUES PRESENTED

The filing presents, *inter alia*, the following issue: whether Laconia's proposed extension of its franchise to the Belmont Lots would be for the public good and thus permissible under RSA 374:22 and RSA 374:26. Accordingly, an adjudicative proceeding will be convened to address this issue.

The Commission will be conducting the prehearing conference and any hearings scheduled in this matter in person. The Commission will consider requests to conduct hearings using a hybrid format to permit remote participation by a specific individual only if the Commission has determined that a sufficient reason has been provided for why that individual would be unable to attend in person. Any party requesting that a specific individual be permitted to participate remotely should file a written request with the Commission's Clerk's Office no later than fifteen (15) days prior to the prehearing conference or hearing date. If the Commission determines that one or more individuals will be permitted to appear remotely, then individuals in the Commission's hearing room, including the Commissioners, will be broadcast on a web-enabled platform.

### Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, that an adjudicative proceeding be commenced for the purpose of reviewing and resolving the foregoing issue pursuant to RSA chapter 541-A, RSA 374:22 and RSA 374:26, and the Commission's procedural rules; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that the Commission will hold a prehearing conference, pursuant to N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.15, at its offices located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire, on December 3, 2024, at 9:00 a.m., at which each party should be prepared to address any of the issues set forth in N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.15; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED,** that the New Hampshire Department of Energy is requested to file its position regarding Laconia's petition, including the reasons for this position, on or before November 20, 2024; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED,** that during the prehearing conference, the Commission will consider the matters listed in Puc 203.15(c) and (d), including the establishment of a procedural schedule governing the remainder of the proceeding. Parties and potential parties are encouraged to facilitate the development of a procedural schedule by conferring prior to the prehearing conference, so that the presiding officer can address any matters on which there is disagreement during the prehearing conference; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that, immediately following the prehearing conference, Laconia shall make appropriate personnel available for the parties to hold a technical session to review the filing; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that any entity or individual may petition to intervene and seek to be admitted as a party in this proceeding. Each party has the right to have an attorney represent the party at the party's own expense; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that, consistent with N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.17 and Puc 203.02, any entity or individual seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall file with the Commission a petition to intervene with copies sent to Laconia and any other parties on the service list, on or before November 12, 2024. The petition shall state the

facts demonstrating how the petitioner's rights, duties, privileges, immunities, or other substantial interests may be affected by the proceeding, consistent with N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.17; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that any party objecting to a petition to intervene make said objection on or before November 22, 2024; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that the parties may submit a stipulation containing a discovery schedule, statement of any additional issues not identified in this order of notice, and at least three dates on which they would be available for a final hearing in this matter, including how much time will be required, with a request that the prehearing conference and technical session be cancelled, on or before November 26, 2024. The Commission may cancel the prehearing conference and technical session upon approval of such a stipulation; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that parties shall file any proposed exhibits, written testimony, motions, or other documents intended to become part of the record in this proceeding with the Commission. Pursuant to the secretarial letter issued on March 17, 2020, which is posted on the Commission's website at <a href="https://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Secretarial%20Letters/20200317-SecLtr-Temp-Changes-in-Filing-Requirements.pdf">https://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Secretarial%20Letters/20200317-SecLtr-Temp-Changes-in-Filing-Requirements.pdf</a>, all Commission rules requiring the filing of paper copies are suspended until further notice. Parties may elect to submit any filing in electronic form unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. Filings will be considered filed as of the time the electronic copy is received by the Commission; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that routine procedural inquiries may be made by contacting the Commission's Clerk's Office at (603) 271-2431 or <a href="mailto:ClerksOffice@puc.nh.gov">ClerksOffice@puc.nh.gov</a>. All requests to the Commission should be made in a written

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pleading filed with the Commission. Unless otherwise authorized by law, *ex parte* communications are prohibited; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED**, that pursuant to N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.12, Laconia shall notify all entities and individuals desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this order of notice on its website no later than two business days after the date of issue, such publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before November 4, 2024. In addition, the Clerk shall publish this order of notice on the Commission's website no later than two business days after the date of issue; and it is

**FURTHER ORDERED,** that any hearings in this matter shall be conducted in accordance with the attached hearing guidelines.
