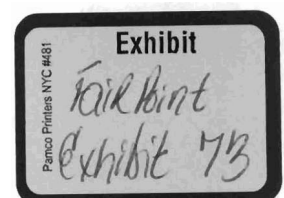

WESTFIELD'S MAIN STREET GOES WIRELESS June 25

Westfield, NY (June 18, 2007) – **FairPoint Communications** in Westfield, NY announces that it has brought broadband connectivity to Main Street in the Village of Westfield. The new wireless Internet (also called WiFi) service is now available to FairPoint subscribers and the general public.

WiFi is a wireless computer network that utilizes radio waves much as cell phones do. A computer must have wireless networking capabilities to use a WiFi network. Most laptops purchased within the last few years have an internal wireless adapter. An external wireless adapter can also be used to receive the network signal.

Wireless equipment has been strategically located on Main Street. The signal extends for approximately a mile, from Moore Park to Westfield Memorial Hospital, including the park and about two blocks on either side of the street. Coverage may vary, however, due to obstructions, trees and buildings.

The wireless network name is "Westfield_Wifi". The first time people attempt to use it their computers will have to scan for the Westfield WiFi network and they will have to manually select the network. After that, the computer will automatically find the network and the user will be directed to a login page.

The service is free to FairPoint Internet customers, who will simply log in using their email addresses and passwords, available from FairPoint Customer Service at 888-270-0663. Visitors to the community or non-customers can use the wireless network and will be charged on an hourly, daily or monthly basis, payable via credit card at the service's log-in page.

FairPoint developed the advanced wireless broadband infrastructure in order to provide free and subscription-based wireless public Internet access and to support the Village of Westfield's economic development.
