I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge you to accept this agreement. I have had solar on my house for 10 years and wouldn't have considered it without net metering. My town also has a municipal array only because net metering made it cost effective. Net metering is crucial to the adoption of solar. Battery technology is promising, but costly, and still in the future on a practical basis. Net metering works right now.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
