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Governor Sununu and members of the NH Public Utilities Commission and NH Department of Energy:

I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement. As a past member of the City of Keene Energy and Climate Committee I am keenly aware of the cost-avoidance offered by the City's net-metered PV installations at the Public Works building and at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, and similar cost-avoidance for many other municipalities, businesses, and residences of citizens of NH. I am also well aware of the benefit that accrues to other rate-payers in NH when the cumulative generation by these distributed generation installations effectively limits the need for activation of "peak power facilities."

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
