I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this settlement agreement. As a member of the Walpole Power Committee, we have worked hard to get a solar array on our town recycling center to offset town energy costs, and increase renewable energy formerly powered by other sources. Net metering is vital to these programs. An end or reduction to net metering compensation will be a serious setback for New Hampshire's energy future.

As a business owner, I would like to install a solar system on my building. Ending or reducing net metering will destroy that option and leave our small business with an unpredictable energy future.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
