The non-partisan highly respected federal research laboratory NREL reports that up to 20% of electric generation can be solar with little or no impact in the grid. With as little as one minute of storage, up to 50% can be solar.

Please accept the Settlement in Docket 22-060. At minimum, New Hampshire needs to maintain net metering policies and work to improve them for rate paying residents. Net metering puts solar energy projects in reach for many who might not be able to pay for these projects otherwise.
